Music, Food, Fun, Flag-Raising Set for Lee District Park Party

Make plans to join your friends and neighbors this coming Saturday, September 18, at Lee District Park as the Rose Hill Civic Association presents a unique celebration of our community's 50th anniversary.

The program begins at 1 pm with displays of old fire and police equipment and food and drink priced at only 50 cents for hot dogs, pizza, and Coca-Cola products. Hamburgers will be available at a slightly higher price. Music, provided by The Koolrockin' Daddies, will begin at 1:00 pm and continue throughout the party except during the flag-raising ceremony.

Come early to make sure you don't miss out on these 'Fabulous 50' prices. Once our generous supply is gone, the table will be empty! The party ends at 5 pm.

We thank Coca-Cola for the soft drinks, Vocelli Pizza of Rose Hill Shopping Center for the pizza, Dove Heating & Air Conditioning for the hot dogs, and Roy Rogers Restaurants in Manchester Lakes, Belle View, and Woodlawn for the hamburgers.

We also thank Fairfax County Fire & Rescue, the Franconia Volunteer Fire Department, the Fairfax County Police, the Fairfax County Park Authority, and the staff at Lee District Park for their support and participation.

We tentatively have scheduled a demonstration by the Fairfax County police dogs (unless they aren't off chasing criminals) and a reenactment of the Civil War raid on Rose Hill.

At 2:30 pm, there will be a flag-raising ceremony to put in place a flag that has flown over the United States Capitol. Congressman Jim Moran, who obtained the flag for RHCA, will speak along with Supervisor Dana Kauffman. The flag will be placed

on the pole overlooking Rose Hill Drive by the Fairfax County Fire & Rescue color guard. The ceremony will begin with an invocation offered by a representative of Pohick Church. The original owner of Rose Hill started the construction of Pohick Church but passed away before it was finished. George Mason finished the job!

Rose Hill residents are advised to walk to Lee District Park. The event will be held in the picnic area overlooking Rose Hill Drive near the carousel, which will be in operation. Only persons with DMV handicapped permits, guests, and vendors will be allowed to park in the lot behind the tennis courts.
