✿ Matthew 6:9-15

⁹“This is how you should pray:

“Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,

¹⁰your kingdom come,
your will be done

on earth as it is in heaven.

¹¹Give us today our daily bread.

¹²Forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.

¹³And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from the evil one.’

¹⁴For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly
Father will also forgive you. ¹⁵But if you do not forgive men their sins,
your Father will not forgive your sins.

- Are tests a good thing or a bad thing for you?
- What is the difference between being tempted and sinning?

1. Understanding Temptation

- What do you think Jesus means by “temptation” here?
- Does this mean God tries to make us sin? (See James 1:13) What does that teach us about God’s character?
- If God doesn’t tempt us, why would Jesus tell us to pray this?

2. Daily Dependence

- How is this request like asking for “daily bread”?
- What does it show about our need for God not just to forgive sin, but to help us avoid sin?

✿ Living the Word/Application:

- If sin is misplaced desire, how do we fight it? By loving something greater.
- How is Jesus better than what your temptation promises?
- When God allows a “test” in your life, what usually gets exposed in you — trust in God, or trust in something else?
- How do difficult situations reveal what your heart truly believes will save you?
