Questions

1. How does viewing yourself as Christ's steward of your life and resources change your perspective on daily decisions?
2. In the parable of the minas, why do you think the third servant was so afraid and critical of his master? What does this reveal about his heart?
3. The pastor mentioned that many Christians struggle with the concept of eternal rewards because they say it feels selfish. How would you respond to someone who feels this way?
4. What are some specific areas of your life (time, talents, resources, relationships) where you feel God is calling you to be a more faithful steward?

5. How does understanding that Jesus will reward us proportionally based on our productivity for Him motivate you differently than just trying “to be good”?
6. The sermon emphasized being entrepreneurial with what God has given us. What would it look like to take more initiative in serving God with your current abilities, resources and circumstances?
7. How can we encourage each other in our group to live more like the faithful stewards who multiplied their minas rather than the one who hid his?

Life Application

This week, identify one specific area of your life where you've been “hiding your mina” - perhaps a talent you're not using, a relationship you're not investing in, or an opportunity to serve that you've been avoiding. Take one concrete step to be more productive and faithful in that area for Christ's eternal rewards. Share your plan with someone who can encourage and hold you accountable.
