FAIR TRADE COFFEE, CHOCOLATE & OLIVE OIL

Church and Society will sell Fair Trade and organic coffee, chocolate, and extra virgin olive oil, on Sunday, **February 8** after worship in the Asbury Room. Please stop by to check out our inventory. We accept cash or checks made out to FUMC with "Fair Trade" in the memo line.

New pricing, starting in **February**:

- All roasts and types of coffee will be \$10 per bag (*except for decaffeinated*).
- Single chocolate bars still \$4, but the price of two increases to \$7 per pair.

Dear Fair Trade Supporters: Equal Exchange was forced to raise prices due to increased production cost as well as geopolitical factors. Unfortunately, we must pass some of the cost increase along. While these changes do challenge us, we believe the products are fairly priced, especially in comparison to other outlets where Fair Trade products are sold. We hope that you will continue to support our mission to build economically just

and environmentally sound trade partnerships with small-scale farmers, fostering fair, democratic, and sustainable relationships between producers and consumers by championing Fair Trade principles, worker cooperatives, and organic practices for a more equitable world.

LENT 2026

The season of Lent is a time of walking into the wild, a 40-day journey filled with wild beasts, wild love, beauty, and challenge; a journey that begins with ashes and ends with joy; a journey that follows Jesus from the depth of the wilderness into the dance of resurrection and new life. The season begins on **Ash**

Wednesday, February 18. We will worship at 7pm in the sanctuary with the Imposition of Ashes. The service will be livestreamed.

This is a journey through color: from ashen gray to glorious purple, charcoal shadow to wilderness green, deep crimson to the rainbow of petals in a springtime garden. The word "Lent" refers to the lengthening of sunlight each day, drawing out the colors from the earth. What better guide to this array of color than the artist Henri Matisse, one of the most innovative and influential artists in modern history, celebrated above all as a master colorist.

From his childhood growing up in a small village in France to what he called his 'masterpiece' (the Chapel of the Rosary in Vence), Matisse explored faith and wilderness throughout his life. He once said he liked to pray with a pencil: "At the moment I go every morning to say my prayers, pencil in hand; I stand in front of a pomegranate tree covered in blossom, each flower at a different stage, and I watch their transformation ... filled with admiration for the work of God. Is that not a way of praying?"

FUMC will coordinate and host nine worship services during the season of Lent: Ash Wednesday, six Sundays, Holy Thursday and Good Friday. At each of these services, the congregation will be invited to share how God brings out the colors in our world. Come Easter morning, our sanctuary will be a brilliant display of colors, resembling an impressive and energetic Matisse composition.

With the words of Scripture and the art of Henri Matisse, we'll head into the wild, journeying all the way to the beautiful, joyful dance of Easter morning, **April 5.**
