

# What is Biblical Discipleship?

Mark 3:13-19 (NKJV)

What is biblical discipleship? We throw out that term. We need to disciple people. We need to be involved in discipleship. And so, I want to ask the question, “What is it?” and seek to answer that out of Jesus’ call to the first disciples.

1. Discipleship is an \_\_\_\_\_ to follow Jesus.  
(Verses 13, 14)

2. Discipleship is an invitation that \_\_\_\_\_ a  
\_\_\_\_\_. (Verse 13, and they came to Him)

3. Discipleship is an invitation that requires a response  
that will \_\_\_\_\_ the rest of our life. (Verses 14,  
15)

He appoints them to **be** something, **do** something, **have** something –

**Be** My disciples, **be** My follower – **Be** with Me and with one another.

**Do** something – go out to preach the Gospel

**Have** something – My power

4. Discipleship is an invitation that requires a response that impacts the rest of our life – and it is offered to the most \_\_\_\_\_ people. **(Verses 16-19)**

In conclusion:

- I'm impressed by the transforming power of Jesus Christ who said *"If you'll follow Me, I will make you; I will create you; I will fashion you; I will empower you; I will change you; I will transform you. I will work in your life in such a way that it will be evident that you have been changed. How? By association with Me."*
- I'm struck in this text with the transforming power of belonging to a group of people who are attached to Jesus Christ.
- And then the transforming power of the message of Jesus Christ.

Discipleship is an invitation that requires a response that will impact the totality of our life and it's offered to the most unlikely people.
