Illness and loss can bring up a lot of emotions.

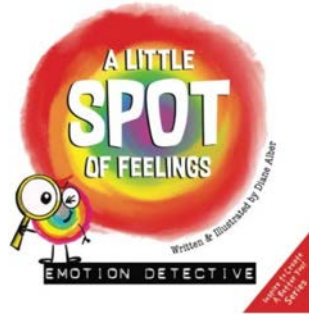
These texts can be a great tool to teach about different emotions and invite conversations about feelings.

When was a time you felt (insert emotion)?

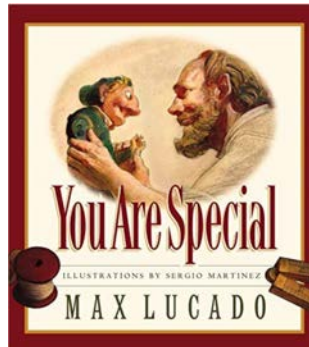
When you feel (insert emotion), what do you like to do?

When was a time you felt multiple emotions at once?



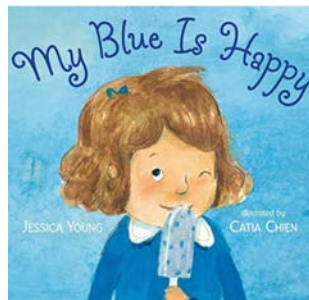
### "A Little Spot of..." by Diane Alber

Each book targets a specific emotion to educate and provide coping strategies



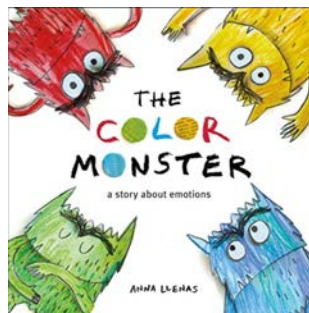
### "You Are Special" by Max Lucado

Whimsical characters teach us that God cherishes every body, just as they are.



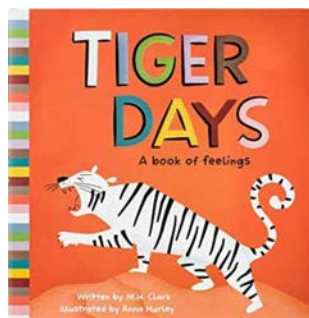
### "My Blue Is Happy" by Jessica Young

This story explains that those we love share an unbreakable connection.



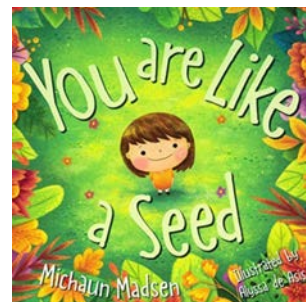
**"No Matter What"** by Debi Gliori

This story explores the depth and unconditionality of a caregiver's love.



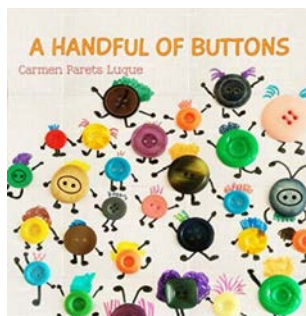
**"You are Like a Seed"** by Michaun Madsen

The similarities between growing a strong, healthy plant and cultivating happiness in our minds are explored.



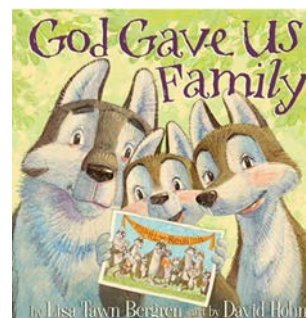
**"A Handful of Buttons"** by Carmen Luque

# Attachment & Separation

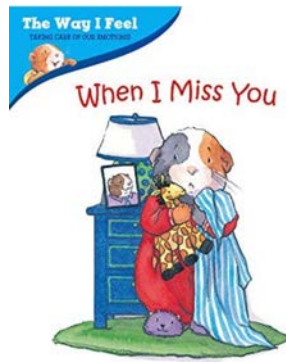
Many young people struggle when they're away from their family. These books teach us how far our love can reach.

What does it feel like to miss someone?

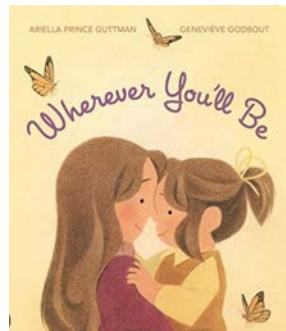
What can we do when we miss someone?

Whether at work or at school, all through the day a mother and daughter find comfort in thinking of each other.



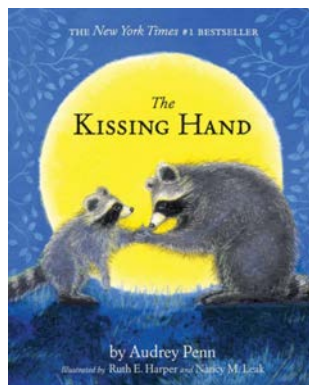
### "I'll Love You From Afar" by Racha Mourtada

This story provides coping strategies for when someone we love is away.

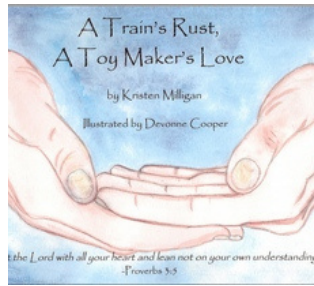


### "The Kissing Hand" by Audra Penn

This story celebrates the dreams, hopes, and longings parents pray over their children.



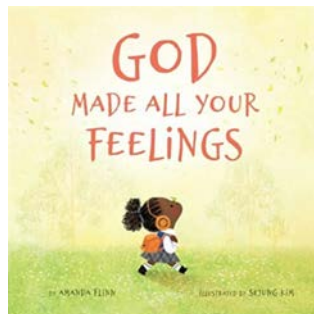
**"This I Know" by Clay Anderson**

# Illness

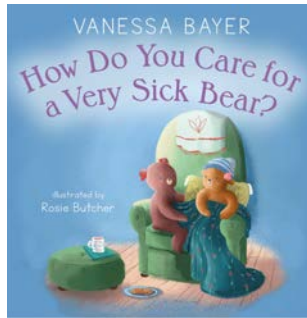
Illnesses are complicated. These texts discuss the difficulties we may experience when someone we love is sick.

How does it feel when someone we love is sick?

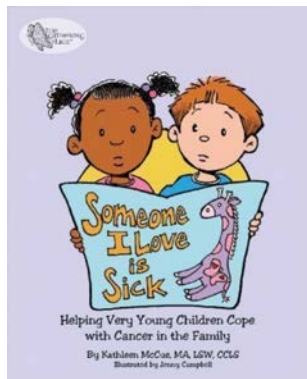
How do you like to be cared for when you're sick?

How can we cheer up or support others who may be sick?



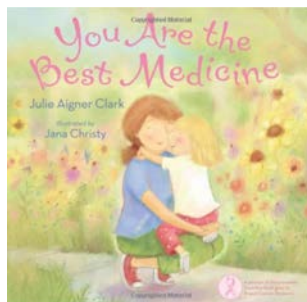
### "How Do You Care for a Very Sick Bear?" by Vanessa Bayer

Gentle and reassuring advice for when someone we love is sick is offered throughout the book.



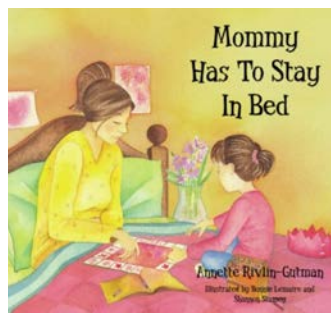
### "Someone I Love is Sick" by Kathleen McCue

A mother and daughter find ways to cope with feelings of frustration and boredom.

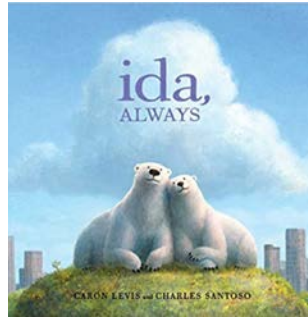


### "But She Can Still Love" by Amalia Flecksteiner

This book teaches that loved ones will stay in our hearts, even after death.



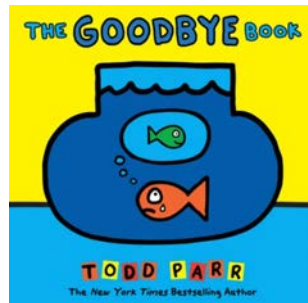
**"Little Mole Finds Hope" by Glenys Nellisti**

When Little Mole is feeling sad, his mother shows him how to look for hope. He finds that signs of spring and hope are everywhere.



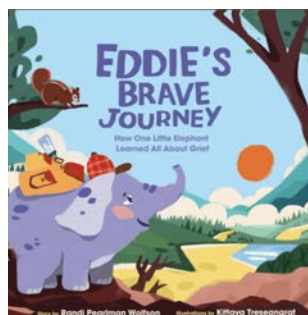
**"The Goodbye Fish" by Todd Parr**

This book reminds readers that it's okay not to know all the answers, and that someone will always be there to support them



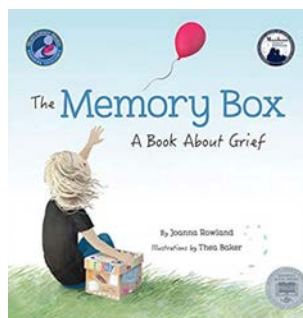
**"Eddie's Brave Journey" by Randi Wolfson**

How do you feel when you have to say goodbye to someone?

What do you like to do when you feel down or miss someone?

What reminds you of a happy memory?



# Teen and young adult

These texts are suitable for older readers. Whether your younger one reads these alongside you or independently, these texts focus on grief, loss, and dealing with death

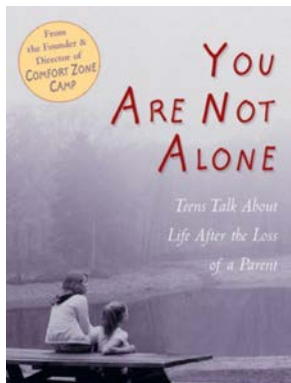
## An idea for the reader:

### "Weird Is Normal" by Jenny Wheeler

Written by a teenager after the loss of her father to cancer, Wheeler helps teens understand some important fundamentals of grief.



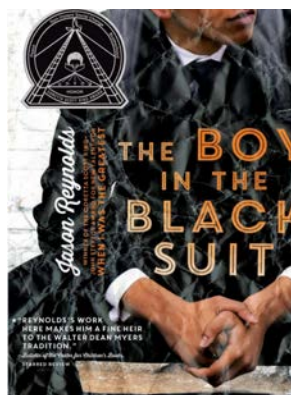
### "You Are Not Alone" by Lynne Hughes

Words of reassurance and strategies for coping with the loss of a parent, by the director of the nation's largest bereavement camp for children.



### "Dancing at the Pity Party" by Tyler Feder

Tyler Feder tells her story of her mother's cancer journey from before diagnosis to after her death in this graphic novel.



### "The Boy in the Black Suit" by Jason Reynolds

A fiction choice with themes of grief, hope, and redemption follow the death of Matt's mom, who died from breast cancer.
