You've seen these words on a sign promising something new and, maybe, exciting. Maybe it's a new restaurant you can't wait to visit. Or, maybe it's a new recreation center you can't wait to experience. In my case, it's a new congregation. In the case of you at Beautiful Savior, it's a new pastor.

Relationships will form. Ministry will take shape. God will do what God has always done—meet people right where they are and invite them into something new.

As I step into this next chapter, I do so with prayer, humility, and joy. I am grateful for where I have been, and I am expectant for what is ahead. May we all remember that in God's hands, every ending is also a beginning—and every beginning carries the promise of new life.

Heather Van Velson made a motion to approve the minutes and financial report from December, Kim 2nd.

Reports:

Preschool – Anne Wilcox

Open House is planned for Friday, February 20th from 1-3pm and again at 5-7pm.

Kerrin will place an ad in the paper.

Anne may do a radio ad on Monday Feb. 16th.

The Christmas program was a success. Parents stayed for dinner, the program and cookies. There was a great number of the prayer partners in attendance.

Tuition for the 26-27 school year will remain at \$115 for the M-W-F class and \$90 for the T-TH class.

The board wants to make sure that any checks dedicated to the preschool are credited to the preschool.

Board of Elders Meeting January 12, 2026

In attendance

Leland Poppe, Larry Wallace, Rod Christmann, Jim Parish, John Flynn, Jeff Boeke, Bob Lantis, and Allen Huff; with guests Pastor Hahn and Mike Steele. Leland Poppe chaired the meeting.

Introductions and Worship service plans

The meeting was held at Mid-Plains Community College, in a video conference room. Pastor Hahn attended via Zoom. Everyone in attendance introduced themselves. Pastor Hahn was given some time to express thoughts, concerns, and schedule targets. There have been several house showings of Pastor Hahn's home this week. The house closing in North Platte is tentatively scheduled for February 6TH. A congregational meeting is set for Sunday, January 18TH, immediately following the worship service, to vote on a bridge loan for the house purchase.

Dates for the installation service were discussed. The best date available for participation by President Snow was selected, which is February 22ND. The time is set for 4PM Central Time.

Neither Visitation Pastor is available to lead the service on Sunday, February 1ST. Pastor Stubenrouch will provide a sermon. Glenn Van Velson will present the sermon. Jim Parish will read the liturgy.

There was extensive discussion about Sunday School times, Confirmation Class times, worship service times, and worship service days; after installation of Pastor Hahn. Glenn Van Velson moved that we have Sunday morning worship service at 09:30 and Sunday School at 10:45; with a mid-week service on Wednesday. Wednesday evening would include potluck supper at 5 PM, worship service at 6:15 PM, and Confirmation Class at 7 PM. John Flynn seconded the motion. After further discussion, the motion failed to pass when voted upon. Jim Parish moved that we have Sunday morning worship service at 10:00 and the Sunday School time to be set by the Education Committee; with a mid-week service on Wednesday. Wednesday evening would include potluck supper at 5 PM, worship service at 6:15 PM, and Confirmation Class at 7 PM. Bob Lantis seconded the motion. Motion carried, with the caveat that there could be adjustment after a trial period.

A question arose about the current Confirmation Class attending training at Our Redeemer, under Pastor Ramsey. Pastor Hahn volunteered to discuss how, and when a transition to classes being at Beautiful Savior for the Beautiful Savior students, would take place. Input from Confirmation student's parents will need to be considered.

Approval of minutes

Jeff Boeke moved that the minutes of the December 8TH Elder's meeting be approved. Bob Lantis seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Unfinished business

With the extensive holiday season, Elder visits tended to be impromptu, rather than formally scheduled, but there were a few members visited during the month of December.

Bob Lantis moved that we have an appreciation meal for Pastor Stubenrouch, on January 25TH. This would be a potluck lunch, following the worship service. John Flynn seconded. Motion carried.

New Business

The mailing out of the monthly newsletter and bulk mailing short comings were discussed. Currently the church does not have a bulk mailing license due to the expense, the additional bundling requirements, and the fact that the bulk mailing service has become very unpredictable. It was pointed out that the newsletter is Emailed out, to everyone who has provided an Email address to the church office, that it is available on the church website, and hardcopies are placed in the church mailboxes. The office secretary will mail out a hardcopy to anyone requesting that she do so, and does already mail them to a few members.

In an effort to spread the word about Pastor Hahn becoming the pastor at Beautiful Savior, a mailing will be sent out to all member households. The mailing will provide details and dates of some of the upcoming events. In an effort to further improve communications, the mailing will provide a form for listing contact information, such as an Email address; and a way to indicate that the respondent would prefer to receive the newsletter by postal mail.

Lenten meals were discussed. The consensus of the Elders was that they would serve a chili soup and cinnamon roll meal on Ash Wednesday. (Post meeting note: the Lutheran Women traditionally do the Ash Wednesday meal, and were already planning to serve it, so the Elders will serve the meal on March 4TH.)

Leland Poppe will ask Pastor Deardoff if he is still using his key for the facilities at Beautiful Savior.

There was a discussion about the need for a security system, or possibly exterior cameras, for the Beautiful Savior facility. Mike Steele will talk to one of his contacts to request an estimate on what it would cost to install a few cameras and remotely controlled door locks for entrances.

Some concern about how dark it is, when trying to enter the north entrance at night, was raised. Bob Lantis moved that we install a motion sensing switch on the light in the vestibule. Jim Parish seconded the motion. Motion carried. Rod Christmann will pursue this task.

Attendees were reminded of the funeral for Bob Reigan, scheduled for Thursday, January 15TH. Several of the Elders said that they would be attending.

The annual subscription for the Portals of Prayer devotional was discussed. The consensus was to proceed with the order as we have done in the past.

Mike Steele asked for an Elder volunteer to be on the 2026 Nominating Committee. Bob Lantis will see what he can do.

Mike Steele also stated that he would like to form a long-range Planning Committee, to plan big picture initiatives. Glenn Van Velson volunteered to serve on such a committee.

Adjournment

Leland Poppe adjourned the meeting at 8:53 PM, at which time the Lord's Prayer was recited.


