

HOMEGROUP QUESTIONS

1. Luke 7:36-50 contrasts two reactions to Jesus. First, there is a woman, a sinner, an outcast who comes into a party uninvited. Her actions show us three requirements in coming to Jesus: (1) Risk (2) Reverence (3) Repentance. What was her risk? How did she show reverence? Where did her actions point to repentance? Then, in your own life, which of these points might God be calling you to grow?
2. By contrast, we see a different but important response from the Pharisee (Simon). Read Luke 7:39. What does that “internal thought” reveal about the Pharisees heart? What does it reveal about our own hearts?
3. Jesus tells a story and then crashes the party with a confrontation. What does the Pharisee’s outward response to Jesus reveal about our own motives?
4. The Big Idea of the message was: Big forgiveness produces BIG love. Little forgiveness produces LITTLE love. What is the relationship of forgiveness and love?
5. As you close, read Luke 7:40, followed by Luke 7:44-47. What tension does Jesus want to raise in your life? Is he telling you something right now? In the Holy Spirit stirring you to something in this passage? Pray for each other.
