The Road To Calvary



Join us for our annual Apologetics Conference with guest speaker, Dr. Derek Thomas. Derek W. H. Thomas, is a native of Wales, but has lived in the United States of America for almost 30 years. He was the Senior Minister at First Presbyterian Church (ARP) in Columbia, South Carolina until his retirement at the end of 2023 after twelve years of ministry at this historic church. He is also a Chancellor's Professor at Reformed Theological Seminary, and a Teaching Fellow with Ligonier Ministries. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from the University of Wales, a Master of Divinity from Reformed Theological Seminary (Jackson), and a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Wales (Lampeter). He was ordained in the Evangelical Church of Ireland and served Stranmillis Evangelical Presbyterian Church in Belfast for 17 years before moving to the United States. He has published

more than thirty books and contributed to many others. He has been married to his wife, Rosemary, for forty-eight years and they have two children and two grandchildren.

The conference will begin with a catered dinner on August 24th at 5:30 p.m. with the first session beginning at 6:30 p.m. The conference will continue Sunday the 25th with Dr. Thomas preaching during our morning and evening worship services. Trail Life Trek

Summer began with a Peak 3 training course in Mountain Rest, SC where 4 patrols of adults and 2 youth patrols learned the skills necessary to put on a Trail Life outdoor event. John Norkus participated as assistant course director and rope work instructor. There was instruction in fire building, knots and lashings, menu planning, wood tools, backpacking, campsite selection, and first aid. Patrols competed against each other in building camp gadgets, best dessert, fire building and patrol spirit.

The troop attended the Southern Summer Adventure at Whitewater Express in Copperhill, TN (June 23-29). Over 500 trailmen attended with troops from SC, GA, NC, LA, FL, AL, IL, and PA. We left Christ Church on Sunday morning and attended morning service at Heritage Presbyterian Church (OPC) in Royston, SC. Each day began with breakfast, morning flag ceremony and daily devotion lead by Rev. Joah Culbertson, pastor of Holly Ridge Baptist Church (Simsponville, SC). Our camp verse of the week was 1 Timothy 6:11: But as for you, O man of God, flee these things. Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness. He brought a daily message on the specific attributes that each trainman should pursue as he grows in grace. Afterwards, trailmen spent the day in various instructional clinics (ropemaking, survival, knots, lashings, foraging, tarps, leadership as well as high adventure activities (waterfront, high ropes, zip line, giant swing, paintball, overlook hike, rifle, archery, slingshot). On Thursday afternoon, the troop ventured to the rapids of the Ocoee River.



A troop from Pennsylvania shared their version of Trail Life vespers with the camp:

*It's the end of another long hard day
On the horizon I see the trail as it fades away
On my honor, I'll do my best
Trusting God for the rest
As I kneel down and pray
I want to hear my Father say*

*Refrain: Well done, you have walked worthy
On the trail this day my son
You have walked worthy.
Not every battle was won,

Steve and Sherri are medical professionals who have been a part of the African church's hospital ministries in Zambia and Kenya for 26 years. They are passionate about equipping African healthcare professionals to serve Jesus in vulnerable communities.

Steve (MD, Internal Medicine/Pediatrics) now heads SIM's Banda Health ministry, using technology to empower the clinics caring for patients in African slums and villages and ministry partnerships to help their communities address overwhelming social and spiritual realities. (Luke 4.18-19).

Sherri (DPT) is a physical therapist currently involved in mentoring and governance.

Prayer:

Pray for a lawyer and nurse joining the Banda Health team in Nairobi to facilitate Banda's growing number of partnerships with other ministries in slums and villages.

Pray for additional missionary software developers for the Banda Health team and for increased funding to also hire Christian software developers in Kenya.

Pray that many families living in very vulnerable situations will find good healthcare and gospel-shaped hope within walking distance of their homes through the work of the Banda team and our partners.

Delighting in God's Word

Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. For because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted. -

Hebrews 2:17-18

In Hebrews 2:17 the author tells us that Christ had to become like us in our humanity, so that he might represent us as our great High Priest before the Father in heaven. In being our High Priest, he was not only offering sacrifice on our behalf, but He also offered himself "to make propitiation for the sins of the people"—that is, he was both the sacrifice and "sacrificer", to satisfy the justice of God. As a man, he identified with his people and took upon himself the punishment for sin that was due for us. More than that, as God, he was able to satisfy that punishment for sin *perfectly* and *completely*. This is indicated for us in other passages of Hebrews: his offering was offered once, a single sacrifice, for sins (Heb. 9:12, 26) and he "sat down" afterward, signaling the completion of his work (Heb. 10:12). This means that if we would know the complete forgiveness of our sins, it is found in Christ and in him alone.

Yet, as amazing as that is, notice what verse 18 says. Jesus Christ, as a true human being, has himself suffered temptations (yet without succumbing to sin). Therefore, he is able to sympathize with us, to resonate with us in our weaknesses, when we are overcome by temptations (Heb. 4:15). If this is the case, that Christ suffered in his human nature by the temptations that confronted him, then notice the implication that Hebrews draws: he is able to help those who are being tempted.

Christian, do you feel the weight of temptations that confront you daily? Do you still feel the draw of your remaining sinful flesh? Do you feel the pull of covetousness? The pangs of greed? Do you desire to do that which does not please God because it would feel pleasurable, if only for a moment? Do you know the sufferings of temptation?

If that is you, Christian, then take comfort in this: in Christ, your sins are *completely* forgiven. And by Christ, especially in the work of his Spirit, you may find help to endure in the day of temptation (cf., 1 Cor. 10:13). Know that Christ understands the severity of temptations. Better yet, flee to Christ, knowing that he is stronger than them all.

Officer Nominations

Beginning on August 4 and continuing through the month of August we will be receiving nominations for the offices of elder and deacon. Nomination forms will be made available to you each week. You will find questions listed below that can help you pray through officer nominations. ("BCO" is the *Presbyterian Church in America Book of Church Order*).

1. Who is eligible (qualified) to be an officer?

Any active male member who meets the qualifications set forth in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1. (BCO 24-1)

2. Can I nominate more than one man?

Yes, you can nominate as many men as the Lord leads you to nominate, as long as they fit the criteria of #1 above.

3. Do I nominate for a specific office (elder or deacon)?

Yes, there are two forms, one for elder and one for deacon.

4. Can I nominate someone if I have not joined the church?

No, only communing members in good and regular standing, but no others, are entitled to submit names to the session. (BCO 24-1)

5. Should I ask the man if he is willing to serve as an officer before I nominate him?

Yes, please ask him if he is willing to serve before you nominate him, it will make the process run smoothly, and keep everyone from doing "double work".

6. Can I email my nomination to the church office?

Yes, please email your nominations to the church office between August 1st and August 31. Any nominations received before or after these dates will not be accepted.

7. Can I mail in my vote if I miss the congregational meeting for election?

No, you must be present on voting day to vote.

A majority vote of those present is required for election. (BCO 24-4)

8. Who gets elected to serve?

Those who receive a majority vote. If there are more people on the ballot than slots available for a particular office, those with the highest percentage of votes will be elected.

A majority vote of those present is required for election. (BCO 24-3)
