New Adult Sunday School Classes Beginning July 7:

- **The Apostle's Creed:** We recite The Apostle's Creed every Sunday during worship, but do we understand what we confess together? In this class we will study together the propositions of this ancient creed and its importance for our life.
- **The Parables of Jesus** (8 weeks) and **Worthy: Living in Light of the Gospel** by Sinclair Ferguson (5 weeks). Jesus taught spiritual truths using short, vivid stories called parables. Together, we will explore these teachings of Christ and learn about his kingdom. Then, in the remaining weeks, we will study Sinclair Ferguson's book, **Worthy**. In this short teaching, we will learn how we might live lives that are Christlike.
