Daniel shared the Gospel with his mother, Rita, and she gave her life to Christ and enjoys going to church with Daniel. "We feel very loved and supported at church," Rita said. For the first time in their lives Daniel and Rita are experiencing the joy of the Lord and walking in the light of His love and peace.

This is the amazing impact a shoebox filled with small gifts can have. Let's all take advantage of this opportunity to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas with girls and boys around the world.
