

11th Annual Missions Conference March 8-10

Speaker: Roland Barnes

Roland S. Barnes was the Senior Pastor of Trinity Presbyterian Church, Statesboro, Georgia for forty-two years. He was organizing pastor of this church body which began as a mission in April of 1981 and was organized in February 1984. Roland is married to his wife of 49+ years, Peaches, and has four children and nine grandchildren.

In addition to leading Trinity Presbyterian Church as Senior Pastor, Roland has served the Presbyterian Church in America in the following capacities:

- Chairman of a Judicial Commission appointed by the Assembly meeting in Norfolk
- General Assembly Ad-Hoc committee to study Church/State Issues
- Secretary of the General Assembly Mission to North America Committee, 1997-2001
- Chairman of the Mission to North America Committee of Central Georgia Presbytery
- Chairman of the Mission to North America Committee of Savannah River Presbytery
- Oversight commissions for the organization of Golden Isles Presbyterian Church (St. Simons Island, GA); Grace Church of the Islands (Savannah, GA); Kirk O' the Isles Presbyterian Church (Savannah, GA); First Presbyterian Church of Pooler (Pooler, GA); New Covenant Presbyterian Church (Richmond Hill, GA); Grace Community Presbyterian Church, (Lyons-Vidalia, GA); Covenant Presbyterian Church, (Dublin, GA)
- Served Chairman of the Advisory Board for Bethany Christian Services for the State of Georgia
- Instrumental in founding of Covenant Care Services, Macon, Georgia
- Founded Choices of the Heart Crisis Pregnancy Center, Statesboro, GA
- Served on the General Assembly Committee for Review of Presbyteries (later served as Chairman of that committee)
- Served on the General Assembly Committee on Constitutional Business as its chairman
- Served on the Committee of Commissions on Administration as its chairman
- Has taken several teams from Trinity Presbyterian Church, Statesboro on short-term mission trips: two to Mexico, two in Costa Rica, one to Ecuador, and five to Peru; in addition he has traveled to Peru as a conference speaker in 2000-2022, twenty-six times; and preached at Missions Conferences in Canada, Mississippi, South Carolina and Alabama.
- Served as the Executive Director of Peru Mission for five years
- Initiated an outreach ministry to Hispanics in the Statesboro area
