Dr. John W. Tweeddale is vice president of academics and professor of theology at Reformation Bible College. He is also a teaching elder in the Presbyterian Church in America and a fellow of the Royal Historical Society. He previously served as senior associate editor of *Tabletalk* magazine, senior pastor of First Reformed Presbyterian Church (PCA) in Pittsburgh, and adjunct professor of systematic and historical theology at Reformed Presbyterian Theological Seminary. He earned his M.Div. from Reformed Theological Seminary in Jackson, Miss., and his Ph.D. from the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. He is the author of *John Owen and Hebrews* and the coeditor of *John Calvin: For a New Reformation* and the *T&T Clark Handbook of John Owen*.

Trail Life Trek

Although troop meetings are on a summer schedule, GA-2215 has been especially busy during June. Several adult trailmen attended Peak 3 training in Mountain Rest, SC with other trailmen, mostly from the Upstate area of South Carolina. Peak 3 is for Registered Adults to learn about the Patrol Method and learn useful outdoor skills that will make troop campouts safe and enjoyable.

The subjects covered included: Setting up troop and patrol campsites, cooking and sanitation, the patrol method, patrol spirit, duty rosters, health and safety, flags and ceremonies, navigation (map and compass), wood tools, ropework, backpacking and tread lightly, plan campfire and flag retirement ceremony.

Navigators and Adventurers had their annual Summer Adventures spending a week camping at Oconee State Park. Each morning began after breakfast with a devotion based on a biblical character and a specific trait which he is known for, such as Joshua: Preparedness, Solomon: Reliable, and Boaz: Chivalrous. Trailmen spent several days hiking in and around the park. On Tuesday, they rafted Section III of the Chattooga River. Along in our rafting group was an American Heritage Girls troop from Orlando, FL, who were doing 4 rivers in 4 days. On Thursday, the crew spent a morning on the zip line canopy tour. One of our guides, Gracie, was from Augusta and attended Davidson, and was now at Georgia College in Milledgeville. The week closed out with a square dance which the park has been having during the summer month going back to before WWII.

On Saturday, June 24, Woodlands Trailmen had their annual Water Fun Day, building and launching water bottle rockets, sliding down a giant slip n slide and participating in a giant water gun fight with over 200 water balloons. The trailmen showed great teamwork in cleaning up the play area in a very short time.

Regular troop meetings will begin the first week in August. Our Join the Trail Night is scheduled for Monday night, August 14, when new families can learn about Trail Life and boys can experience a regular meeting. So invite your friends and their boys (K-12th grade) to come check us out.

She also serves on SIM's International Board of Directors. Steve is a physician who heads SIM's Banda Health project, using technology and gospel-shaped relationships to reach and empower frontline healthcare providers in East Africa's slums and villages.
