Derek W. H. Thomas, is a native of Wales, but has lived in the United States of America for almost 30 years. He was the Senior Minister at First Presbyterian Church (ARP) in Columbia, South Carolina until his retirement at the end of 2023 after twelve years of ministry at this historic church. He is also a Chancellor's Professor at Reformed Theological Seminary, and a Teaching Fellow with Ligonier Ministries. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from the University of Wales, a Master of Divinity from Reformed Theological Seminary (Jackson), and a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Wales (Lampeter). He was ordained in the Evangelical Church of Ireland and served Stranmillis Evangelical Presbyterian Church in Belfast for 17 years before moving to the United States. He has published more than thirty books and contributed to many others. He has been married to his wife, Rosemary, for forty-eight years and they have two children and two grandchildren.

### Ministry:

Serving in the province of Turin, Italy. Eliseo, Paula and their family help provide care for families through hosting and leading sports camps while coordinating volunteers from international churches and organizations. They are passionate about discipleship and mentorship and are collaborating with community leaders exploring how to offer intentional care for refugees and needy people.

Eliseo's current assignment with Association for Persecuted Christians (ACP) ([www.avc-en.org](http://www.avc-en.org)) is to Coordinate the Northern Italy Activities, such as the Evangelical Social Work Association which includes around 40 different churches or associations. Eliseo's efforts also go to leading the local church and the discipleship movement ORME NETWORK. We also organize and lead teams of Italians to serve in refugee camps in Athens, Greece. Paula plans and coordinates special events, Bible studies and camps for children, youth and families in our area. With ACP she coordinates short term mission opportunities and promotes and empowers churches to join the Gift Box initiative which provides help and good news to children, elderly, and families in poverty ([www.acp-it.org/azione/apr](http://www.acp-it.org/azione/apr)).

# Go and Make Disciples

## Delighting in God's Word

*But you, when you pray...*

Matthew 6:6

When Christians are asked, "How is your prayer life?", the response will almost inevitably be something like this: "Well, it could be better." Do you agree with that statement? I think we all might to some extent.

Why do we respond like this? Why do we feel the weight of our own prayerlessness? It is because you and I, as Christians, are called to be people who pray. To put it another way, as Christians, we were *made to pray*.

Notice in Matthew 6:6 that Jesus says, "But you, *when* you pray". Jesus will go on in verse seven to say something similar, "when you are praying". He goes on in verse nine to say, "Pray, then, in this way". What do all of these phrases have in common? Christ *assumes* that his people are praying. It is *expected*.

J.C. Ryle put the same point provocatively: "I ask again whether you pray, because *a habit of prayer is one of the surest marks of a true Christian*." J.I. Packer, in *Knowing God*, shared the same conviction: "People who know their God are before anything people who pray...If, however, there is in us little energy for such prayer, and little consequent practice of it, this is a sure sign that as yet we scarcely know our God."

If we were to put a fine point on this teaching, it would be this: Christians pray. That's just what they do. Just as cows say, "moo"; just as dogs bark; just as "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons" (Titus 1:12), *Christians pray*.

Is this true of you? Are you one who prays, Beloved of God? Let us give ourselves to prayer, as our Lord has commanded us (1 Thess. 5:17). Let us see that it is of the utmost importance to our fellowship with God. Let us join with a hearty, "Amen!", when we pray together in corporate worship. Let us join in prayer together in smaller groups---we have a few such groups in our church that meet weekly! Let us go into our closets---our cars, our bedrooms, our quiet places, our front porches---to communion with our God in prayer.

May our church be known for its life of prayer. May we be known as people who pray!

## American Heritage Girls




