*Ecuador
Mission to the World*

Rick and Betty serve in Ecuador among the Quichua Indians. Rick's ministry focuses on leadership training, literature production, Bible translation, and church planting in the Quichua Indian language. Rick and his family served for many years in a cooperative agreement between Mission to the World (MTW) and Wycliffe Bible Translators, working in Colombia from 1981 to 1994. His first wife, Heidi

Marie, died in 1997 after a long battle with cancer. In 1998 Rick was reassigned to Ecuador to work in the Quichua Indian language.

Rick and Betty met in Ecuador in 1999 and married in 2000. Betty served with HCJB Global (Ecuador radio station) from 1992 until she married Rick. She worked in an international television production studio, producing Christian programs in Spanish for Latin America. She continues to produce videos on an occasional basis. After a two-year church-planting internship in Bogotá, Colombia, Rick was ordained as a pastor. In 2015 the Aschmanns returned to Ecuador to begin a new church-planting work among the Quichua Indians. Rick has also been involved in Bible translation projects in two of the Quichua languages of Ecuador to provide God's Word in the heart language of the Quichua people.

Ministry:

Rick and Betty Aschmann serve in Ecuador among the Quichua Indians. Their son, Nathan and daughter, Anne, are both attending college in Nebraska. Rick's ministry focuses on leadership training, literature production, Bible translation, and church planting in the Quichua Indian language.

Prayer:

Pray that God will guide us as we continually search for any and every way possible to reach the Quichua-speaking people for Christ. And praise God that through the health crisis, many of the Quichuas in our church plant have grown closer to the Lord and are learning to depend more on Him.

Praise God that the Old Testament translation for the Central Highland Quichua language is well underway and the Lord has provided funds for the next year of translation. Please pray that the translation will continue going strong and that God will provide various native Quichua speakers to do a final check.

Pray that God will continue to keep us safe and healthy, despite the rampant crime and health issues in Ecuador and around the world.

Music Ministry News

Dr. John Wilson will be joining our staff on July 1 as the Director of Music. John is currently the Director of Music at Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where he spent 12 years working with the international television ministry of Dr. D. James Kennedy. Dr. Wilson holds a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Conducting from the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago and a Master of Sacred Music Degree from the School of Sacred Music in New York City, where he studied organ with Alec Wyton and conducting with Abraham Kaplan. His undergraduate degree, also in Church Music, from Westminster College (New Wilmington, PA), where he recently received the Westminster Alumni Citation Award. He had additional graduate study at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, N. J., where he studied choral conducting with Robert Shaw and Wilhelm Ehmann. He also holds the Associate and Choir-master Degrees from the American Guild of Organists. Over the years, he has conducted most of the major sacred choral works with full orchestra and has produced 7 CD recordings. He has been married to Lisa Blyler Wilson for 46 years, and they have 3 children and 9 grandchildren. Lisa is the Director of the Diane Bish Center for Music and the Arts and is also the Associate Organist at Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church.

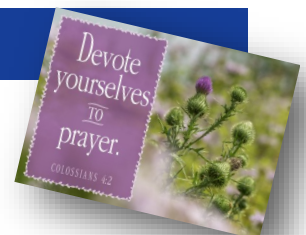
