True Reformation

Awakening is at the very heart of the Christian faith, and it is the reason we are Christians. Awakening is the powerful work of our sovereign and gracious God. When He awakens us, He doesn't simply awaken us from sleep, but from death. Awakening is the glorious work of regeneration, revival, and reformation. When God awakens us, He regenerates our hearts, gives us the gift of new birth, and makes us alive. He says to us, "Live!" ([Ezek. 16:6](#)). The Holy Spirit invades, conquers, and persuades us. He rips out our stubborn, self-trusting hearts of stone and replaces our dead hearts with new, living hearts—hearts that are made willing and able to believe; hearts that are soft and pliable in the hands of our Father, united and lovingly enslaved to Christ, and indwelt by the Holy Spirit.

When God awakens, He always brings revival, whether it is the revival of a single soul, the revival of a family, the revival of a community, or the revival of a nation. When God brings revival, He always brings deep and convicting repentance that leads to a life of faith, repentance, and obedience. When God awakens, He always brings true and lasting reformation—reformation of hearts, lives, homes, and churches. However, we cannot schedule awakening, and we should not attempt to devise a superficial, formulaic scheme to bring about awakening. D. Martyn Lloyd-Jones said, "A revival never needs to be advertised; it always advertises itself." Awakening happens only when God ordains it. He brings about awakening according to His sovereign plan. He brings about awakening where He wants, when He wants, and to whom He wants, all according to His good pleasure.

Nevertheless, just as God ordains awakening, He ordains the means of awakening. God not only sovereignly ordains the ends of all things, He ordains the means of all ends as well. And the means that God has ordained to bring about awakening are the ordinary means He has already ordained for our regular weekly worship and daily growth in grace. The Word, prayer, and the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper are the ordinary means of grace God has given us. These are the means through which the Holy Spirit works to bring true conversion, true revival, and true reformation. God's awakening power is not activated by our schemes and tactics, but by His Spirit and His ordinary means of awakening. And we must trust Him to do precisely what He pleases to do according to His sovereign wisdom, resting in the promise that the light of His countenance shines upon us as we live before His face, *coram Deo*.

Steven and Rachelle Smith

The Smith family are local missionaries who serve daily in front of Augusta's only abortion facility known as A Preferred Women's Health Center. When the facility is open and taking clients, there is a Christian witness actively being salt and light. Steven stands daily pleading for lives, preaching to souls, and offering assistance to all of those participating in child sacrifice, even to those passing by. God loves children, and He loves to have His Son's name heralded in the streets. With up to 20 children being led to death by the hands of their own parents, it is estimated that nearly 60 souls will hear the Word of Life, at a time and place where it is most needed, at the doors of death per day.

Steven was officially commissioned as a REF Missionary in 2019. This is a hard ministry, but it's also rewarding. God has chosen to show much fruit over the last 9 years: turn-aways and babies saved, assistance and baby showers, divine appointments, discipleship, and personal sanctification—all to the glory of God. We thank both the Lord for His faithfulness and also you for your prayers and support.

Prayer:

- Pray for Steven and others as they minister outside of the killing center in Augusta, GA. Richmond County attempts to limit gospel proclamation and outreach in front of the abortion mill by enforcing subjective noise ordinances that have been previously contested and ruled unconstitutional. The Richmond County Sheriff Office has been making its presence known daily and have already cited several people for their efforts to reach the lost and rescue children and even arresting Steven in November 2020. He is currently waiting for a trial date for a federal lawsuit filed against the RCSO for the unlawful arrest and consistent harassment he has endured over the years.
- Perseverance and Protection- This type of ministry not only brings fatigue, but spiritual warfare. Pray that weaknesses may be shored up in strengthened in the joy of the Lord.
- Boldness— to proclaim the truth where the truth doesn't want to be heard.
- Pray that the principalities and powers that roost there will be bound in Jesus' name. Perhaps He will soften hearts, open eyes and ears, and set the captives free.
- Pray the Church will actively seek to end abortion through righteous bills of immediate abolition instead of incremental regulation.

Book Review

A Little Book on the Christian Life by John Calvin

Books about the life of a Christian are numerous. Some have stood the test of time, while many have not. This little treatise by John Calvin is one of those books that has made its impression felt upon Christians throughout history.

What makes it worth the time, especially amongst all the other resources that are out there? John Calvin, in these few pages, manages to cut to the very heart of the Christian life. He briefly handles the core issues of Christian living. He is not programmatic or pragmatic in his discussions. He does not give five steps toward your “best life now”. Instead, he reminds readers of those general principles of Christian life, which will forever be of aid toward growth in Christ.

Calvin first teaches about self-denial. He instructs readers to look to God and His will, considering His will above one’s own. Further, the Christian must consider other’s needs above his own. In self-denial and humility, the Christian grows.

Second, he teaches about suffering. Calvin gives a warm, pious invitation to receive suffering as God’s own discipline. God disciplines those He loves—and by discipline, his people grow in all virtue.

A third principle is that the Christian ought to be heavenly-minded. It is only once the Christian has his eye set upon heaven that he is able lift his eyes above the earthly pleasures, temptations, and distractions of this life. Having a heavenly mindset keeps the Christian from pursuing those things which avail little. In this section, Calvin also addresses the fear of death and how the Christian can look forward to their dying with great hope.

Lastly, Calvin teaches about the fact that a love for heaven does not mean that we hate God’s good creation. He teaches his readers that we may readily enjoy the things of this earth, so long as we keep their true purpose in mind—to point us back to God.

This book is a succinct presentation of the foundational principles of Christian living. If the church would heed Calvin’s instruction, she would be challenged in her walk of faith. Yet, she would also find a great freedom in this pursuit of God. And in the end, she will find the things of earth growing strangely dim.
