
What: Churchwide Memorial Day Picnic


When: Monday, May 29 beginning at 10:00am

**Tim & Lana Higginbotham – North American Indigenous Ministries,  
British Columbia, Canada**

Tim, born in Columbia, SC, moved to Canada as missionary kid in 1970. He met Lana in high school and graduated from Seattle Pacific U. in 1991. Lana, born in Richmond, BC, currently works for Trinity Western University as the Director of Operations for the School of Human Kinetics. They have three adult children - Brooke 30, Jordan 28 and Madison 26.

**Ministry:**

2021 will go down as a watershed year in Canadian history. At this point, around 7,000 unmarked graves with remains of Indigenous children have been discovered at residential schools...institutional partnerships between the federal government and churches...whose purpose was 'civilizing and Christianizing' indigenous children. These schools began in the late 1880s and the last one closed in the 1990s. Legitimate outrage has been expressed at the government and Catholic Church in particular. The Canadian government has instituted an annual Day of Truth & Reconciliation to remember and honor all those who died or attended these schools.

For an organization involved in missions work to First Nations/Native Americans...this put us squarely in the cross-hairs...but has also given unprecedented interest in our mission and mandate. Individuals and churches turned to NAIM asking legitimate questions like, "Why did this happen? How can we learn more? What can we do?" The church is being given an opportunity to become involved in a healthier way in communities and individuals that saw the dagger instead of the crucifix. I've told many that my heroes in the faith are Indigenous people, who often have more reasons not to trust God but choose to in spite of the history. We've continued to navigate life in the face of Covid and how it impacts ministry. Thankfully, things in both countries seem to be loosening up...gatherings of believers are happening. But the US/Canada border remained closed most of the last 20 months and is now only open for crossing if one is fully vaccinated and can prove a negative test. We have staff on both sides of the border. We are not immune to the greater stressors in society. Thankfully, I feel my call and passion for Native ministry as strong as ever...not that it doesn't ebb and flow some days, but I am grateful to be involved.

**Prayer:**

- ◆ We are having a challenging time, made more so by Covid, recruiting and retaining millennial generation staff. Over the past year, we have had a 'generational expert' train personnel on dynamics with millennials and Gen Z.
- ◆ As a result of the above, we are making 4 significant changes organizationally.
  - Develop training for better equipping in ministry & disciple-making.
  - Look into coaching training for all supervisors.
  - Integrate younger perspectives into leadership.
  - Integrate a Teams model for engaging with staff.
- ◆ Please pray for wisdom as we balance the programs of NAIM with the regulations from government agencies.


