
What: Churchwide Memorial Day Picnic

U. of AL at Birmingham
RUF-I

Stephen and Kellie both grew up in Georgia dreaming of being missionaries. Following God's leading, they met as teammates teaching English in China for a year as adventurous, world-changing college students. They walked away from that experience with a love for the Chinese and a growing love for each other that continues to this day.

They happily spent their first three years of marriage in Birmingham,

and then in 2003 they returned to China to raise a family and join in God's kingdom work there. Stephen and Kellie have four children: Miles (10/2005), Amelia (11/2007), Grady (5/2010), and Oliver (3/2012). RUF-I is a ministry of the Presbyterian Church in America. They host dinners, discussion groups, and activities to help international students and scholars explore the deep questions of life. They work with the local church to help provide free services such as ESL tutoring. In January of 2020 the Merwin family went to a week-long conference in Thailand, just as the coronavirus began to spread. They never made it back home. Instead, God brought them to the States to renew their call to reach the nations by ministering to international students at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) with Reformed University Fellowship International. Stephen began ministering at UAB on January 1, 2022 and is still numb with joy that God is calling them to this work.

We are entering our fourth year of ministry with Reformed University Fellowship—International at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. Through gospel hospitality and witness, we seek to reach close to 2,000 internationals from over eighty countries at UAB. We partner with several ministries to host a free, weekly meal for one hundred students each week. Twenty to thirty volunteers come as well to engage in guided discussion and establish deeper relationships. We've also started a small Scripture-reading group for seekers in addition to a Bible study and fellowship for international believers. Our weeks are full and the opportunities seem endless.

Prayer:

- Please pray for us to make wise decisions on who to minister to and what programs we should develop to best reach the students God brings to us with the resources he has given us.
- Pray too for our family as we enter a new season of life. Miles, our oldest, is in his first year at Samford University. We miss his daily presence and cheerfulness at home, but we are grateful he is still in the same city. Amelia, now seventeen, has a strong heart for missions and is continues to grow as a servant leader in her youth group. Grady and Oliver are doing well in school and have made some great friendships.



John Wilson will be joining our staff on July 1 as the Director of Music. John is currently the Director of Music at Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where he spent 12 years working with the international television ministry of Dr. D. James Kennedy. Dr. Wilson holds a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Conducting from the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago and a Master of Sacred Music Degree from the School of Sacred Music in New York City, where he studied organ with Alec Wyton and conducting with Abraham Kaplan. His undergraduate degree, also in Church Music, from Westminster College (New Wilmington, PA), where he recently received the Westminster Alumni Citation Award. He had additional graduate study at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, N. J., where he studied choral conducting with Robert Shaw and Wilhelm Ehmann. He also holds the Associate and Choirmaster Degrees from the American Guild of Organists. Over the years, he has conducted most of the major sacred choral works with full orchestra and has produced 7 CD recordings. He has been married to Lisa Blyler Wilson for 46 years, and they have 3 children and 9 grandchildren. Lisa is the Director of the Diane Bish Center for Music and the Arts and is also the Associate Organist at Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church.




A Field Guide on Gender and Sexuality by Ligonier Ministries
