


What: Churchwide Memorial Day Picnic

Church Planting SE Asia

David and Maddie Dyer live with their team in South Asia. The team consists of three families with six children, including the Dyer's daughters, Carlyn and Hadassah. Under the supervision of our elders at Summit Church, the church will be considered our sending organization. In addition to the church, we are connected with OPEN USA which provides training, mentorship and accountability. Their philosophy is to come alongside the church with resources and guidance while allowing the church leadership to make the final decisions for those going to the field. OPEN also specializes in business as missions.

After studying the language, we plan to use a leather business as a platform for ministry and discipleship in the country. We started Beloved Leather Co. in the summer of 2019 and the Lord has allowed it to grow exponentially over the last few years. After speaking with several missionaries throughout SA, they all supported this business model because it provided a legitimate means for a long-term visa as well as a platform to engage with nationals and their culture.

Ministry:

Our vision and goal, as a team, is to present before God a throng of locals who love Jesus Christ. Our heart is to use this business model and education as a means to form relationships with the local people. We strive, as a team, to glorify God by establishing Bible-believing, Gospel-centered churches led by local believers who through obedience to Christ will impact their family, community and nation for the glory of God.

Prayer:

- As we close out, our biggest request is prayer. Both missionaries and local pastors have stressed the need for daily prayer. As we take steps to serve and live in SA, we are asking you to join us through prayer.
- Language learning – specifically to complete the first level of language school, then to move on to more specialized study. For Maddie to find a language tutor.
- Business licenses and certification prior to a visit to the USA in April.
- Visa: approval of “Private Investor Visas” which depends in part on complete approval of the leather business.
- Our Family as we raise Carlyn and Hadassah and live in a new country. Please pray we would seek the Lord continually for wisdom and peace in our decisions.
- The people of SE Asia, for the Lord to soften their hearts and reveal to us the right people to work and connect with to build gospel centered relationships.

Trail Life Trek

On Monday, April 22, Woodlands Trail launched water bottle rockets across the campus as they worked on their Science and Technology branch awards.

The troop participated in the National Trail Life Campout weekend. Thousands of trailmen across the country experienced outdoor adventure this weekend. The troop camped at the Presbyterian Peninsula on Lake Thurmond. Adventurer trailmen instructed Woodlands trailmen in land navigation, fire safety and building, wood tools, flag folding and etiquette, and knots. We had great weather and the only hazard was dodging dive bombing cicadas.

Some may ask why we use to outdoors as part of a spiritual and leadership development program. We believe there is something special about being outdoors. Camping, hiking, and other outdoor activities help build deep relationships and allow boys to develop character, practice leadership, and experience adventure. The outdoor focus helps a boy appreciate the wonder, majesty, and grandness of God as reflected in His creation.

Future activities include a rock climbing day and service projects with the Family Y and Flags In at Bellevue Memorial Gardens in preparation for Memorial Day. Also, members will be participating in Peak 3 training in Mountain Rest, SC, training adult trailmen in how to conduct outdoor activities.



Delighting in God's Word

"But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work." – 2 Timothy 3:14-17

Psalm 1:1-2 gives us a picture of the person who is blessed. The blessed man, we are told, is the one who does not walk with the wicked, stand with the sinner, or sit with the scoffer. In other words, the blessed man is the one who does not "do life" with the wicked. Rather, his "delight is in the law of the LORD" – he loves God's Word, rather than the ways of wickedness, and he meditates upon it because he knows that the ways of God are life-giving.

We are commended in these verses in Psalm 1 to love God's Word, because in them we may know great blessings. But what are those blessings? Why ought we love the Word of God and what benefits does God's Word grant us? Paul gives us a picture of Scripture's blessings in 2 Timothy 3. We see three particular benefits in these verses:

First, the Scriptures make us wise for salvation. In the Bible, we have the plan of salvation clearly laid out before us. Without the Bible, and its message, we would not know the fullness of the Triune God's salvation, won for us in Christ. In the Bible, we learn that all have sinned (Rom. 3:23) and are, therefore, condemned to death (Romans 6:23). In the Word of God, we also understand that Christ was sent into the world to save sinners (1 Timothy 1:15) and that he has transferred us from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of the Son of God (Colossians 1:13). And we know, by the Word of God, that all who would believe in this Son have an interest in his saving blood (John 3:16). This is the message of Scripture, which gives us wisdom—true wisdom that points us to salvation in Christ alone.

Second, in the Bible, God speaks to us. We see this in the words, "All Scripture is breathed out by God". The picture of this phrase, "breathed out", is that the Scriptures are God's very exhalation. There is an old adage that says, "When the Bible speaks, God speaks." If you desire to hear God's voice, if you wish to know what God has to say about an issue, the Bible is where you may find it.

Notice as well that the verse doesn't say, "Some Scripture", but it says, "All Scripture". Some scholars suggest that this verse could, instead, be translated, "Every Scripture", suggesting that it is not just the sum total of the Bible that is God-breathed, but it is every word, every sentence, every letter that is inspired by God. When you read the Bible—yes, even difficult or seemingly innocuous passages—you are reading God's own handwriting. What a grace of God!

And third, the Bible is a blessing to us because it is profitable. It is not profitable in the sense that it makes us feel good or tickles our ears. Yes, we read beautiful and wonderful promises in the Word of God, which find their "yes and amen" in Christ. But the Bible is profitable because of its promises and its corrections. The Scriptures are beneficial to us because of its teachings and its admonitions. The Bible comforts and chides us, encourages and amends us. God's Word is not one-dimensional; rather, it equips us for a full life.

The Word of God is a blessing to us. Paul's words in 2 Timothy remind us that the Scriptures bless us in the fact that, in its pages, we learn of salvation in Christ, that God speaks to us, and that in the Word, we find instruction and correction for every aspect of life.

Psalm 1:2 encourages us to meditate upon this Word, because of its blessings for us. So let us take it up and read it—and know God's blessing!


