## Operation Christmas Child


**November is Shoebox Collection Month!** Stop by the display table in the foyer and take as many shoeboxes as you can fill. Instructions, gift suggestions, and labels are inside the shoeboxes. As you do this, you will be sharing in this exciting project that not only delivers gifts but brings hope, joy, and the message of the Gospel to girls and boys around the world.

Did you know?

- Since 1993 over 200 million shoeboxes have been delivered around the world.
- Shoeboxes are delivered by plane, truck, boat, oxcart, horseback, and even camels.
- This is the only gift many of these children will receive.
- 50 million boys and girls have been discipled through a follow-up program called the Greatest Journey.
- Since 2009, more than 17.4 million children have reported decisions for Christ while taking The Greatest Journey.
- There are 4,500 sites across the country prepared to receive your prayerfully packed gifts during collection week.
- Christ Church, Presbyterian has participated in the Shoebox Project for 19 years.
- Shoeboxes filled online go to countries that are hostile to the Gospel.

Jenn

Missionary to Africa

Serving in harm's way

On December 15, 2007, after forty years of running from God and pushing him away, Jenn changed direction and gave her heart and life to Jesus Christ.

In June of 2010, the Lord put a specific calling on her heart to go and serve in Africa. In October 2010, she went on a short-term mission trip to Kenya, and this is where she first fell in love with Africa and felt a calling into long term missions. In 2012 Jenn was appointed to be a member of an outreach team in Northern Madagascar and from April 2013 through October 2015 she served among an unreached people group there. It was during her time in Africa that the Lord planted both a love for and desire to reach Muslims with the Gospel and called her to pursue a nursing degree and to return to Africa using her nursing degree to serve long term among a Muslim people group. Jenn returned to the US in October 2015 and followed the Lord's call to nursing school. After receiving her B.S. in nursing In December 2017, she had an extended time of training and equipping prior to beginning her term of service among the African Diaspora in Southwest Missouri. From October 2019 through October 2021, Jenn served as Health Director for the non-profit RAISE (Refugee and Immigrant Services and Education). Other ministry included facilitating Bible-based Trauma Healing Groups, and working to encourage, train, and equip the local church to reach out to their Muslim neighbors.

Ministry:

In March 2022, Jenn will be returning to Africa where she will be serving as a nurse at an orphanage run by an Islamic non-profit organization. Her primary focus will be working with an associated program that provides education, training, and resources to children with disabilities and their families from the surrounding area. This position will allow Jenn to demonstrate the love of Christ through compassionate care for these children and families. Building relationships with the children, their families, and her co-workers will provide opportunities to pray with them, to have spiritual conversations and to share the Gospel. Other ministry opportunities include collaboration with the nursing and medical schools on a new rehabilitation program for children and adults and a collaboration with a colleague in a neighboring city to begin utilizing a Bible-based Trauma Healing Program.

Prayer:

- Pray for strength, perseverance, discernment, and wisdom during this time of tilling, planting, and watering. There is currently no church and few believers.
- Pray for safety and the Lord's protection. This is a difficult place with great darkness.
- Pray that the Lord will build strong relationships with co-workers, children & families leading to many opportunities to demonstrate and proclaim God's love, truth, and hope.
- Pray for joy and perseverance in language learning so that the Gospel can be shared in the home language.
- Pray for a strong team bond. May each member serve together in unity and reflect His light and love both individually and as a team.




