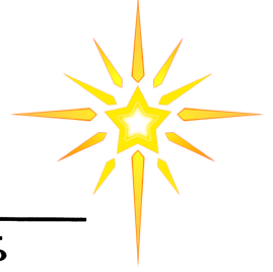

When we think of Valentine's Day, most of us picture heart-shaped boxes of chocolate, red roses, and those pastel candies with messages that range from sweet to silly. Yet behind the commercial gloss is a much deeper and far more meaningful story. Valentine's Day is named after not one, but three Christian martyrs named Valentine. The most well-known of them, remembered on February 14, was a Christian priest living in Rome during the third century — a time when faithfulness to Christ often came at a very real cost.

According to tradition, this Valentine lived during the reign of Emperor Claudius II, who believed that unmarried men made better soldiers. In the emperor's mind, wives and families weakened military resolve, so marriage for young men was forbidden. Valentine, however, recognized both the God-given gift of marriage and the injustice of the decree. Trusting God rather than earthly authority, he continued to secretly marry Christian couples, honoring marriage as a holy vocation instituted by God for mutual love, faithfulness, and service.

When Valentine's actions were discovered, he was arrested and ultimately executed. His martyrdom reminds us that Christian love is not merely sentimental or convenient. It is sacrificial. It costs something. Valentine bore witness to a love shaped not by self-interest, but by obedience to God and trust in His promises. In this way, Valentine's story echoes the heart of the Christian faith itself — a faith grounded in the self-giving love of Christ, who gave His life for us while we were still sinners.

For Christians, then, Valentine's Day is more than a celebration of romance. It is an opportunity to reflect on the many forms love takes within God's design. We rightly give thanks for romantic love and Christian marriage, but we also celebrate the love between parents and children, the love shared among friends, and the love that binds the church together as the body of Christ. Above all, we rejoice in God's steadfast love for us — a love that does not depend on our worthiness, but on His grace alone.

As we mark Valentine's Day, may it point us beyond candy hearts to the true source of love, God's heart. May it remind us that love is not something we manufacture or purchase off a store shelf, but something we receive from God and are called to share with others. In a world hungry for real love, we are sent as witnesses — to our neighbors, the poor, the lonely, and the sick — bearing the love of Christ in word and deed. That kind of love, God's sacrificial love in Christ Jesus, is a Valentine's message worth sharing.

At FELC, we will be picking up that Valentine message of God's sacrificial love in Christ Jesus throughout our upcoming observation of the Lenten Season. From Ash Wednesday, February 18th through Good Friday, April 3rd we'll offer a supplement to Sunday's gatherings with midweek services to help cleanse our hearts and minds to enable us to be better servants of God's love. Please take a look at the differing opportunities of fellowship, prayer, worship, and service this newsletter provides and pick the way you'll send a Valentine to God this Lenten season.

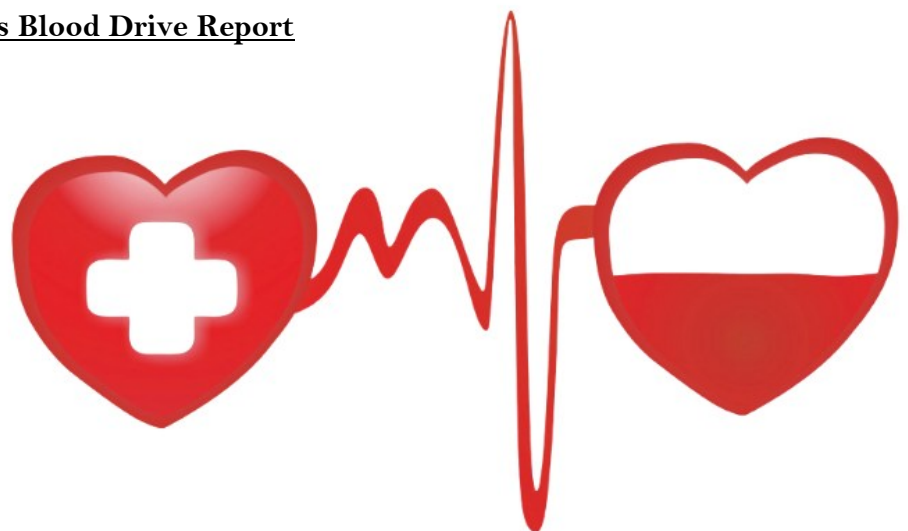

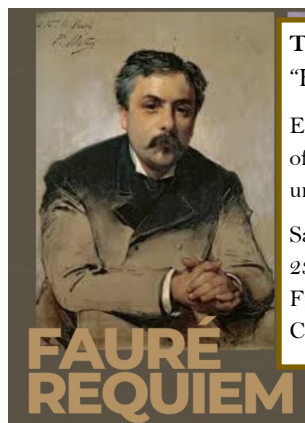

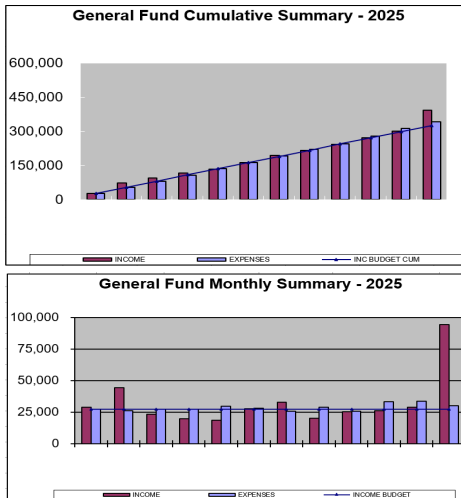
