WE LISTEN TO GOD’S WORD

FIRST LESSON (*Pew Bible* p. 2)

Genesis 2:15-17,3:1-7

Our first scripture reading is from the Old Testament, the book of

Genesis, the second chapter beginning with verse fifteen.

¹⁵ The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. ¹⁶ And the Lord God commanded the man, “You may freely eat of every tree of the garden, ¹⁷ but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.”...

^{3:1} Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, “Did God say, ‘You shall not eat from any tree in the garden?’” ² The woman said to the serpent, “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, ³ but God said, ‘You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die.’” ⁴ But the serpent said to the woman, “You will not die, ⁵ for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.” ⁶ So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food and that it was a delight to the eyes and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. ⁷ Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked, and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

PSALM (*Pew Bible p. 440*)

Our Psalm for today is Psalm thirty-two. I invite the congregation to read it aloud with me.

**¹ Happy are those whose transgression is forgiven,
whose sin is covered.**

and in whose spirit there is no deceit.**

**³ While I kept silent, my body wasted away
through my groaning all day long.**

**⁴ For day and night your hand was heavy upon me;

**I said, “I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,”

SECOND LESSON (*Pew Bible p. 921*)

Romans 10:8b-13

Our second lesson comes from the New Testament, the Apostle Paul's letter to the church in Rome, chapter ten, beginning with verse eight.

⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): ⁹ that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame." ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him. ¹³ For "whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved."
