

Ministry Opportunities

Thank you so much for your prayers for us in September as I traveled back to SC to speak at Bob Jones University during their Global Opportunities week. Pictured with me at our display table in the student center is Annette Williams, the previous hospital director who served in Togo for 40 years!

It was a wonderful privilege to speak to the student body in chapel, in workshops, in classes and in individual meetings.





October and November were some of the most unique weeks we've experienced so far. For 5 straight weeks, we either had a wedding or a funeral service. Never before in such a concentrated time have we experienced the up-and-down rhythm of life, the truth that "to everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven" (Eccl. 3:1). Mingled with the joyous celebrations of two marriage ceremonies were the times of grief and mourning during three funeral services. One of them was a hospital employee who died suddenly at age 39, leaving a wife and 2 young children.



Needless to say, his death came as a shock to everyone. I had the opportunity to preach at his funeral the Gospel hope that, though every human being is under the curse of death, those in Christ have the hope of eternal life and await a certain resurrection! "As in Adam all die, even so in Christ, shall all be made alive" (I Corinthians 15:22).

The Local Church

The Togolese church needs your prayers. Just this past week, the Togo government announced that proof of vaccination against Covid-19 is now required for church attendance, effectively forcing vaccinations if people want to attend public worship. Pray for wisdom and discernment for the church leadership as they navigate what to do.

Thankfully, the pastors see this for what it is--a tactic of spiritual warfare, and not a public health issue (since people can frequent markets and sporting venues without any restrictions). As of now, they have decided collectively that the government can say what it wants to say, but that the church won't enforce it. Anyone who comes to public worship will be welcomed, and they will keep meeting as God commands and teaches. We are grateful for church leaders who are willing to take a stand! Please pray for your Togolese brothers and sisters in Christ, that God would grant wisdom, clarity, unity, courage and peace during this time.

Specific Prayer Requests

Thank you for your continued prayers for these requests:

1. For a Muslim background believer to train as a chaplain for our hospital ministry. There are still several unreached people groups in southern Togo from these predominately Muslim tribes.
2. For the Togolese church as they navigate government restrictions on gathering.
3. For the kids' club ministry in the Muslim community on Wednesday afternoons to bear fruit.
4. For Arwen Mallay to receive God's miraculous healing, or to receive His grace to walk through suffering and the valley of the shadow of death.
