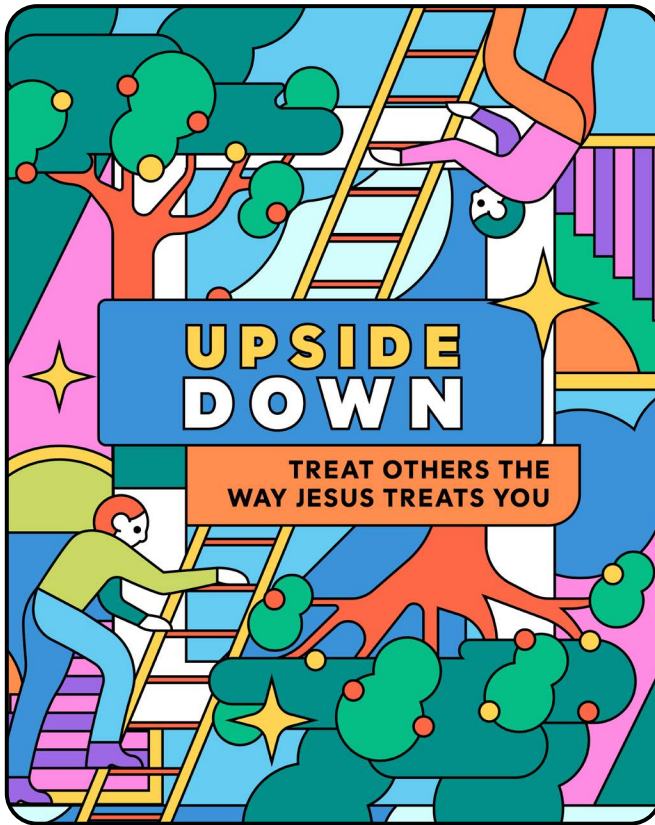

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Learn from God's Word.

Note to Ministry Leader

You may have heard what Jesus lived and taught described as “The Upside-Down Kingdom.” Though Jesus is King of the universe, He entered our world as a humble carpenter. Instead of demanding that others serve Him, Jesus healed, listened to, and cared for the people deemed most unimportant. Rather than living in a palace and depending on horses and chariots, Jesus walked long, dusty miles on His own tired feet. By our world’s standards, that’s completely upside down!

This month, we want kids to discover how the Bible defined success—through humility and service. We explore how John the Baptist pointed people to Jesus, rather than to himself, and meet the Roman Commander who, despite power and position, bowed to the authority of God. We take a look at how Jesus taught us to love our enemies and—through the story of Martha and Mary—how it’s important to give our time to Jesus first, before doing things for Him. Finally, we wrap up the month with Jesus’ humble entry into Jerusalem, and how He washed the feet of His disciples, instructing them to serve one another in the same way. Through it all, kids will discover that being first is less important than putting others first.

HEADS UP



When Jesus tells us to "turn the other cheek" and "go the extra mile," He is not suggesting that we should become doormats. Instead, He challenges us to make an active choice not to repay evil in kind. When we do, we show we can't be controlled and are trusting God to make things right. Make sure kids understand that loving an enemy does not mean allowing yourself to be continually bullied or hurt. Sometimes loving an enemy means ensuring that they are not able to continue harmful behavior.

Many of us feel more like Martha than Mary—especially in a culture that values productivity so highly. Even kids can fall into the trap of believing they need to do all the right things to be loved. Explain to kids that Martha's desire to serve Jesus was a good thing—but she was doing it from a place of stress and frustration. Jesus loves it when we slow down and spend time with Him first, so that we can go out to serve and love others from a place of rest and peace.

Weekly Summaries

Week	Bible Story	Summary
1	John the Baptist Is a Witness About Jesus	Throughout the month, we take a look at humility in the life of Jesus, and in the lives of people He encountered. In Week 1, followers of John the Baptist are up in arms about all the people going to follow Jesus. He's the competition, right? But John the Baptist is secure in his calling—that his whole purpose is to point people to Jesus, rather than to himself. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>Jesus must increase. I must decrease.</u>
2	A Roman Commander Has Faith	In Week 2, meet a Roman commander who comes to Jesus for help. Instead of asserting his power and status, the man humbly asks Jesus to heal his servant. The commander even trusts that Jesus is so powerful that He only needs to speak and the boy will be made well. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>Remember God is most important.</u>
3	Be Humble/Love Your Enemies	We follow up in Week 3 with Jesus' teaching to "turn the other cheek" and "go the extra mile." Rather than paying back our enemies in kind, we show they can't control us when we choose to love like Jesus ... and trust God to make things right. Bottom Line: Love like Jesus even when it's hard. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>Love like Jesus even when it's hard.</u>
4	Mary and Martha	Week 4 brings us to the story of Mary and Martha. While Martha whips up a frenzy of activity to prepare for their guests, Mary simply sits at the feet of Jesus. When Martha finally explodes about her sister, Jesus doesn't send Mary to work. Instead, Jesus affirms that what Mary has done in spending time with Him is even more important than doing things for Him. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>Make time for Jesus first.</u>
5	Palm Sunday/ Jesus Washes His Disciples' Feet	We wrap up the month as Jesus approaches Jerusalem during Passover week. Days after entering Jerusalem on a donkey, to the cheers of a multitude, Jesus celebrates the Passover meal with His closest friends. Instead of demanding that He be served, Jesus takes on the role of the lowliest servant by washing His disciples' feet ... even those of Judas, His betrayer. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>Jesus showed us how to be humble.</u>

Social 15 minutes Providing time for fun interaction	Includes an opening activity as kids arrive. This time encourages kids to enter the classroom and engage with peers and Small Group Leaders by providing fun, age-appropriate, hands-on activities that introduce new concepts they will hear in the Bible Story.	→ Plan for one or more of the activities. → Review the Small Group document for props and supplies needed. → Lead activities in different areas of the room while a designated leader greets parents and children at the door.
Worship 10 minutes Inviting kids to respond to God	We recommend worship songs that amplify teaching content for the month. We've created these songs to be developmentally appropriate, incorporating simple, direct language, fun dance movements, and upbeat, current arrangements. Songs are preloaded into APlay and available for purchase at store.thinkorange.com .	→ Recommendation: Have a Worship Leader and live instruments to sing along with the music tracks. → Encourage small group leaders to model what it means to worship by participating in worship using words and motions and encourage children to follow along. → Share music links with parents so they can stream them at home or in the car.
Story 25 minutes Communicating God's truth in engaging ways	Includes various methods of storytelling to engage every kid as they learn about God's Big Story and the part they can play in it. This time encourages kids to be active participants in their faith and not just bystanders.	→ Choose an engaging adult to tell the Bible Story. This person should be able to command the attention of preschoolers through animated storytelling. These scripts are written to be "told" and not "read." Advance preparation is necessary.
Groups 25 minutes Creating a safe place to connect	Includes activities written to reach every learning style. These activities will reinforce the Bottom Line introduced during the Bible Story and help kids apply it to real-life experiences.	→ Plan for as many of the activities as possible. → Review the Small Group document for props and supplies needed. → You may want to lead one activity at a time. Or offer two activities at once and allow half the children to participate in each. Then switch groups and repeat the activities.

How to Use

So as you plan, try mixing it up! You'll see an assigned Activity Stamp listed with each activity to show you how it's designed to engage kids best.

One week you might do a "Made to Move" activity, and the next week might be "Made to Create." Both help kids connect with God in meaningful ways.

Using a variety of stamps throughout your time helps every kid feel seen and gives them a chance to connect with God's Word in a way that makes sense to them.

Create the Environment

General Tips

Declutter your environment.

While the relationships are what matter, a cluttered space is less inviting.

Create great signage that is easy for kids to read.

If multiple small groups are meeting in one large room, consider using chalk board easels or A-frame signs so parents and children can instantly see where to go.

Display the Theme Art, Bottom Line, or Memory Verse in photo frames at check-in so parents know what their child is learning.

You don't have to go all out, but even little touches go a big way!

Think theme art colors or utilizing your screens if you have them.

Tips for This Month

Use these ideas as starting point to bring the theme to life in your space.

Upside Down

This can be one of the easiest months to decorate. Do you have posters in frames in your environment? Turn them upside down. Hang anything upside down—chairs, lamps, clocks—to spark your kids' curiosity so you can teach them about the marvelous upside-down way that Jesus calls us to treat others. And with Palm Sunday falling on the last Sunday of the month, consider changing the environment a week early to make Holy Week a little easier on you and your team.

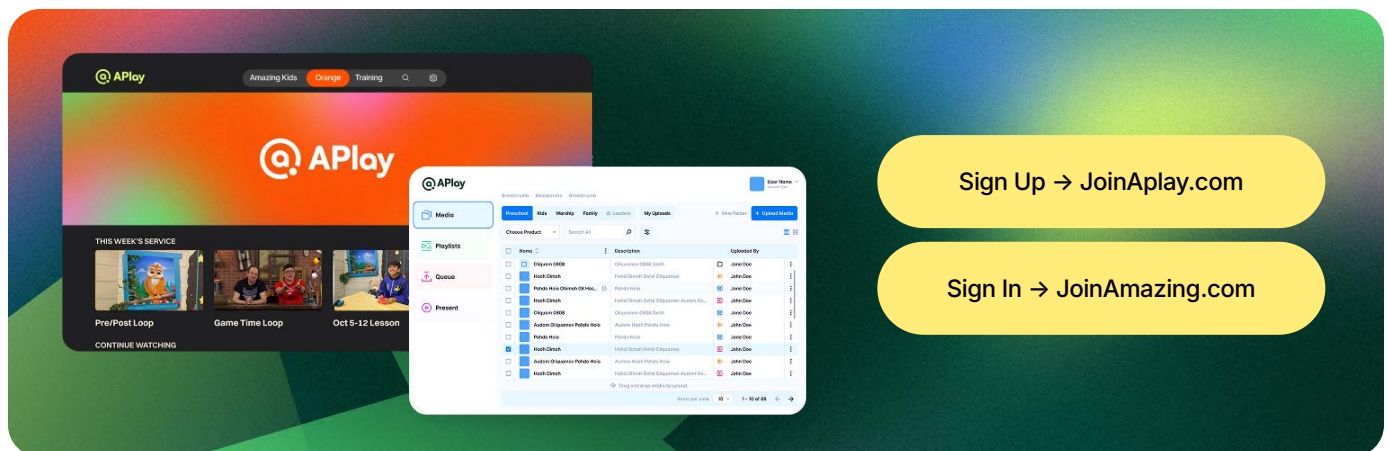

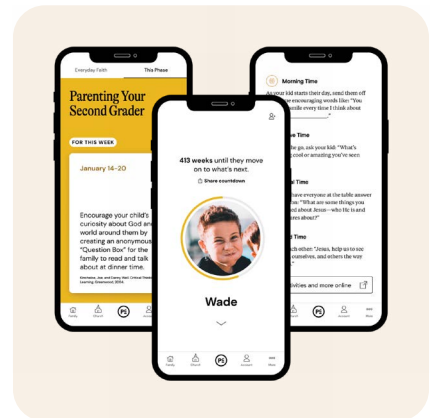

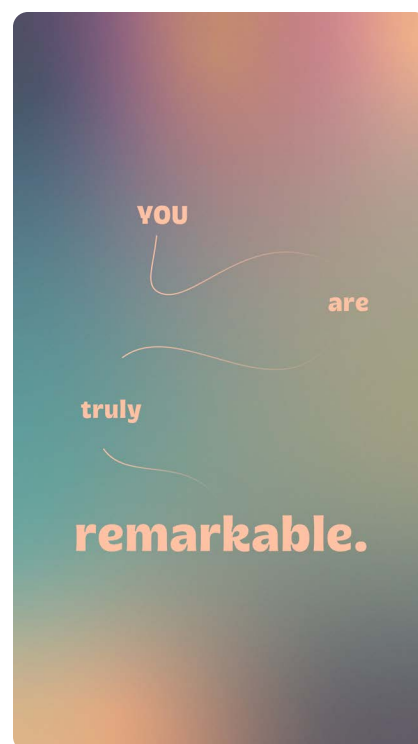

Statement of Faith

About God
