### Reflection Philippians 4

What does Paul have to celebrate in prison? He has the gospel and he does continue to celebrate despite the unjust loss of his freedom. Not only that, he exhorts the Philippians to celebrate (rejoice) for the same reason. Philippians 4:4 is one of those verses that should be read in the worst times. Not because it gives us false hope, but because it forces us to think of the truth of the Gospel in the hard times. In fact, what Paul seems to imply is that when life is difficult meditating on and celebrating in the Gospel is what can help us balance and refocus our lives. Deliberate celebration helps us overcome the anxiety and stress that can so easily overwhelm us.

unity, and love within the community?**

Sisters and Brothers,

This year I want us to re-commit to paying attention to Scripture. But we do not simply read for information; we read for transformation. I am grateful for all of you who read through Philippians with me in January. I think Paul's message of rejoicing in the midst of suffering is as timely now as ever. And thank you to everyone who shared with me all your thoughts about Philippians I genuinely appreciated learning from you.

In February, I would like us to take time to read Matthew's Gospel. This is the Gospel for the liturgical calendar this year and so it is fitting to read it. If you are not aware, there are 28 chapters in Matthew and so I will be committing to reading one chapter a day. And like I said, I want this to be transformative, so I want to read this in a modern translation that will hopefully use language that is new to me and so strikes me differently and makes me think. For this reason (and because I have not used it much) I am reading through The Message. It is not important which translation you use, but I thought you would appreciate how I am approaching the text.


Here are some themes that I will be thinking about.

- The kingdom of heaven is here, being citizens of this kingdom
- Jesus is Emmanuel, what does it mean that God is with us.

# A Week in the Life of a Slave
