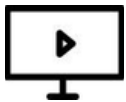

***Affirmation of Faith**

From *The Confession of 1967*

God's reconciling act in Jesus Christ is a mystery which the Scriptures describe in various ways.

It is called the sacrifice of a lamb, a shepherd's life given for his sheep, atonement by a priest.

It is also described as the forgiveness of sins, the reconciliation of enemies, and the gift of righteousness.

In Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting human trespasses against them. God's reconciliation in Jesus Christ is the ground of the peace, justice, and freedom among nations...The church is called to bring all people to receive and accept this reconciliation in Christ.

Congregations, individuals, and groups of Christians find reconciliation in their own lives and are called to pursue it in society. The church proclaims no other Lord than Jesus Christ.

The church is faithful to the gospel when it bears witness to God's love for all people and serves humanity in obedience to Christ.

In gratitude to God, empowered by the Spirit, the church strives to be faithful -

trusting that God's reconciling work is already at work in the world.

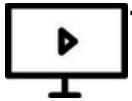

The Confession of 1967 - United Presbyterian Church

This was written during the troubled 1960's and the civil rights movement in response to civil religion. Its central doctrines include reconciliation and the equality of all persons. Banner: The Blue, Red and Gold: Colors of the official seal of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America; The Golden, Down-reaching Hand: (repeated from the Nicene Banner) God reaching down to his world; The Crown (repeated from the Westminster Banner) and the Nail Scarred Hand: The death and victory of Christ; The Four Hands of Different Colors, the Clasped Hands, and the Green Circle: The reconciled world at the foot of the cross; The Stars and Planets on the Blue Background: The Space-Age Setting of this confession.

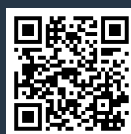

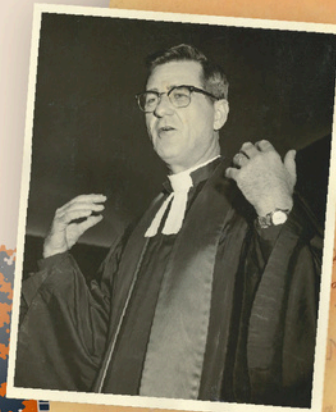
