In 2025, we saw God move powerfully in the lives and hearts of our VC men.

This past year, we got to watch our Men's Group explode in many areas. From spiritual growth, to physical size, and men stepping up to be the Godly Men they are called to be.

Men's Group has become this band of brothers who would go to battle for one another. It has created this culture of unity, vulnerability, and a willingness to serve. There were several moments that were incredible and evidence God is doing something in His men. One moment in particular was a Thursday evening, during our small group discussion time a group of men got up from their table, out of their chairs, laid hands on their brother, and prayed over him. Men showing up for men. Men walking together and living out their calling to be Godly Men.

This past year, we walked through the life of Moses and watched how God forms men over time. We saw God's faithfulness, His covenant promises, and what it looks like to lead with humility, trust Him in uncertainty, and obey even when it costs us. As we traced Israel's deliverance, we were reminded that the gospel didn't begin in the New Testament, but God was already pointing to Christ through Egypt, the wilderness, the law, and the tabernacle. Moses' life taught us that godly manhood is shaped by surrender, perseverance, and dependence on God not strength or status. Ultimately, every lesson led us to Jesus, our true Deliverer and Mediator.

We are so excited for this new year for Mens Group! We can't wait to see how God is going to continue to work and move amongst the hearts and lives of His men in 2026.



MARRIAGE MINISTRY

In 2025, God continued to bless marriage ministry at Vintage Church in lots of ways, some old and some new. We have, for years, hoped to provide a weekendlong marriage retreat. We have done seminars, and one day conferences and even a two day marriage conference at Vintage. But to date, the only overnight event that marriage ministry had hosted was for the staff marriage retreat. This is a wonderful event, but we have longed to do this type of event for our entire church. In 2025, we finally saw this happen and we were so blessed to have this event (in February) fill up so quickly that we decided to offer it again, a few weeks later (in March). The feedback from leaders and attendees was such a blessing to us. Words like “long overdue”, “growth”, “life changing” were just some of the words used to describe these two retreats. It took a great team of people to pull these off, but Jason and Jennie Austin were invaluable to the success of these two events. We truly could not have done them without the Austins.

Married Couples Community Group officially had to relocate from Auditorium B to the Main Auditorium because we outgrew that room! Lots of new faces, but also lots of old ones, too. This group went from just the two of us leading in 2021, to having Casey and Rebecca Harris co-lead for a couple of years. Now Jason and Jennie have been co-leading for over a year. But in 2025, we saw that need grow even more as we have enlisted the support of a more formalized child care program, with the help of Sananda McGehee, to assigning key couples within the ministry to being door greeters and table leaders (in order to make sure new folks have someone to engage with and to lead conversations). It has been wonderful to see this ministry move (literally and figuratively) into a new season.

Our pre-marital counseling curriculum went through a huge transformation in 2025 as well. The video series and written curriculum have lifted a huge weight from us as far as teaching and one on one meetings. We still meet with engaged couples one on one, but the workbooks and Welcome to Marriage classes have been a huge step forward in this part of marriage ministry.



Counseling continues to be a great need within the church. Honestly, the demand for it/need for it, is overwhelming at times. So many marriages are hurting or worse. So much more could be said on this, but to our staff and our elders, please just know that this need continues to be great. We are really no different than other churches in this area and by no means do we see the need for marriage counseling as a “Vintage” issue, but a human issue and one that we, as believers, need to continue to be true to what we know Scripture says about marriage.

One of the new ways marriage ministry was able to serve was on the fall trip to the Czech Republic. While Chris led the adult sessions for the BICF Annual Retreat, we were both able to lead a special marriage session after lunch on Saturday. We took questions from the church and spent about an hour diving into the issues that they

were concerned about or had questions about. The questions were amazingly similar to the types of questions we get at Vintage, so we felt very equipped to address each of these head on. It was truly a blessing to serve our brothers and sisters at BICF in this way.

We are filled with excitement and hope for what God will do in 2026 as He continues to mend and strengthen marriages through this ministry. Be in prayer for our upcoming marriage retreat in just a few short weeks where over 60 couples will attend. We are asking God to do what only He can that weekend. We can't wait to share stories of His faithfulness and grace.



SERVE THE CITY

LOCAL & REGIONAL OUTREACH

2025 was a truly remarkable year for Serve the City! We joyfully fulfilled our mission to connect people with one another and our community through intentional service, mobilizing hundreds of volunteers, stewarding generous resources, and meeting real needs in powerful ways.

Through strong partnerships with the Family Crisis Center, Lydia's Place, Run 5 Feed 5, Neighborhood Cafe, and Randleman's schools, we served faithfully and continued to build lasting relationships in our community. We kicked off the year supporting families in crisis with collection drives and dessert packaging for the Port-A-Pit fundraiser. Spring brought focused care for women and children at Lydia's Place through supply collections and family-style meal preparations, which we also provide throughout the year.

Summer addressed childhood hunger with Run 5 Feed 5 as the church rallied to collect, sort, and prepare food supplies. We loved seeing our church family participate in their annual 5K!

Before the new school year, we blessed local schools with supplies, teacher appreciation boxes & treats, and sent volunteers to pray at all of our Randleman school locations. Fall featured our biggest Serve the City Day yet: over 100 volunteers served at four sites—beautifying Randleman Middle School, maintaining properties at the Family Crisis Center and Emmy's House, organizing the Run 5 Feed 5 pantry, and tackling projects at Victory Mountain Camp—followed by a free community lunch.

Our largest outreach ever came at Thanksgiving: with extraordinary generosity from our congregation and community, we served 452 households (2,235 individuals) through 120+ volunteer teams, distributing 450 turkeys, 450 pumpkin pies, and 607 food boxes—the most extensive Thanksgiving effort in our history.

Throughout the year we consistently showed up in schools, neighborhoods, and partner organizations, bringing compassion, faith, and hope to thousands.

A heartfelt thank you to every member of our congregation for your incredible generosity—with your time, gifts, and servant hearts. Your faithfulness made 2025 a year of abundant blessing for our community, and we are deeply grateful as we look forward with excitement to all God will do next!



LOCAL BENEVOLENCE

Did you know that a portion of your giving to Vintage is set aside to financially provide for people in our church & community who find themselves in vulnerable positions? This year we were able to pay rent, cover electric bills, and purchase material goods like propane, groceries, gas, school supplies, clothing, and Christmas gifts for people in our church family. As much as we can say YES, we do!

As you can imagine, we also receive a lot of requests from people in our community for financial assistance. We have a team who evaluates these needs and discerns if and how we can meet those needs. In many of these cases, we are so grateful for strong partnerships with Run 5 Feed 5, Family Crisis Center, and Lydia's Place who can often provide what we cannot.

Thank you, VC for how you give. Your financial support very often means provision for the people who are sitting around you at church on Sundays.

CZECH MINISTRY

English Camp - Church Retreat



This year wrapped our fifth year of ministry partnership with Majak Ministry Center and Brno International Christian Fellowship in Brno, Czech Republic. We increased funding support for the Paraventi family and Bryn Beyer, whom we had the pleasure of hosting at Vintage for a week in April.

This summer, a team of twelve people from Vintage traveled to Czech to serve as staff & leaders for the English Camp hosted by Majak. This is an awesome time to make friends with Czech natives and also share the love and hope we have in Jesus.

A few months later we sent a team of eleven people to serve as kid ministry staff for BICF's church retreat. Chris Foster served as the main speaker for the retreat with an emphasis on relationship dynamics we have in Christ. He and Nikki, our marriage ministry leaders here at VC, also had the opportunity to lead sessions on Christ-centered marriage.

We believe that God has ordained and worked to bring this partnership into existence for this particular point in his story and we pray for his continued provision, and protection over our friendships and partnership in Czech. We pray that we will see the fruit of this investment as God's kingdom comes in Czech as it is in heaven!

ABOVE + BEYOND 2026

A Year of Big Steps Forward

In 2025, God continued to do far more than we could have asked or imagined. Thanks to your incredible generosity, we successfully closed on the entire property that has been our home for years, securing a permanent place for Vintage Church to grow and serve our community for decades to come.

We've made tremendous progress on the renovation plans. After many meetings with our contractor and architect, we finalized a design that checks nearly every box on our priority list: a secure, self-contained children's ministry wing for vKids, a large and flexible overflow space that can seat over 200 people (and double as student worship and community group space), and many more bathrooms—all without displacing a single tenant and without ever having to shut down worship or ministry on site. We are genuinely thrilled with how these plans turned out.

To date, you have given \$602,002 toward Above + Beyond. A large portion of that made our \$700,000 down payment possible, and we were also blown away by a single \$200,000 gift. Every dollar—large or small—has moved us closer to the vision God has placed before us.

We're continuing Above + Beyond into 2026 because we still have a significant gap to close in order to move forward with the renovation plans. We've raised about 40% of our \$1.5 million goal, so there is still plenty of room for God to move through your continued faithfulness.

Thank you for believing in this dream and for investing so generously in the future of Vintage Church. We can't wait to show you the final plans and walk with you into an even brighter 2026!
