Stewardship: Time, Talents, and Treasure

Stewardship is the responsible management of the gifts and resources entrusted to us. In the Parable of the Talents from the Gospel of Matthew: Chapter 25, Jesus reminds us that everything we have ultimately belongs to God. We are not owners, but caretakers, called to use our blessings wisely and generously.

First, stewardship of time means recognizing that each day is a gift. Time is limited and precious; once it is spent, it cannot be regained. Being a good steward of time involves prioritizing what truly matters—faith, family, service, and personal growth—rather than wasting hours on unproductive pursuits. When we dedicate time to prayer, community involvement, and helping others, we honor the One who entrusted it to us.

Second, stewardship of talents refers to the abilities and skills each person has been given. These talents may include teaching, leadership, creativity, kindness, or practical skills. Rather than hiding or neglecting our abilities, we are called to develop and use them for the benefit of others. When we share our talents in service—whether in our workplace, church, or community—we contribute to the common good and reflect gratitude for what we have received.

Finally, stewardship of treasure involves the responsible use of material resources and finances. Money and possessions are tools that can either serve selfish desires or support meaningful causes. Wise stewardship encourages generosity, careful planning, and a willingness to give to those in need. By managing our treasure with integrity and compassion, we demonstrate trust in God and faithfulness to Him.

I give thanks to God for the faithful Stewardship you all have displayed and pray that we each continue to search our hearts on how we can support our church and school both now and, in the years ahead.

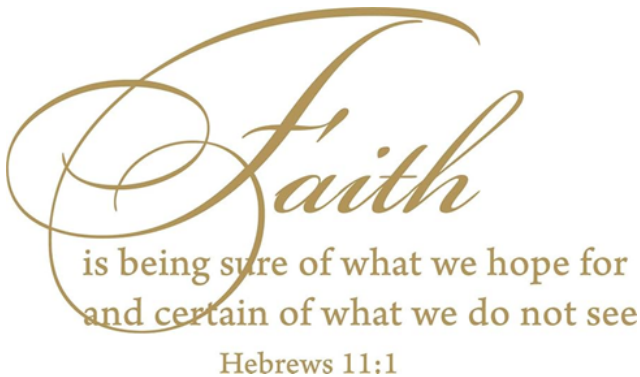

FOCUS ON WORSHIP

Hidden with Christ, by Deborah Reiss



This beautiful definition of faith from the book of Hebrews is followed by a long and inspiring list of people from Israel's history who demonstrated such faith. One of the most poignant, and possibly most difficult, examples is the willingness of Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac on Mt. Moriah (later to be known as Mt. Zion, the temple mount in Jerusalem). The story from Genesis 22 has layers of rich meaning, especially during Lent, because of God's command to sacrifice "your only son...whom you love," the substitute ram

that was caught in a thicket, and God's promise that through Abraham's offspring "all nations on earth will be blessed." These were all fulfilled in the life and ministry of Jesus. We know the blessed ending for us and for Abraham, but what about Abraham's faith before he knew how it would turn out?

Hebrews offers one explanation, that "Abraham reasoned that God could raise the dead, and figuratively speaking, he did receive Isaac back from death" (Hebrews 11:19). We have talked about this in Bible Study, and most of us think "Good for Abraham, but I could not do it – how could God ask such a thing?" I would like to turn the focus back to what Abraham shows us about faith and about God.

Isaac was a gift from God after Abraham lamented that the one thing he wanted was a son to be his heir. When God asked Abraham to give up his son, Abraham had a choice to make. He knew without doubt what God wanted, but he had to be willing to trust that God had a purpose in this command and that whatever God commanded would ultimately be a blessing. Whether Abraham anticipated a resurrection, or another son, or some other future, his obedience was an affirmation that he could trust God in all things. He was sure of God's earlier promise that "I will establish my covenant with [Isaac] as an everlasting covenant for his descendants after him" (Genesis 17:19). He was certain that "The Lord Will Provide" – the new name he gave to the mountain.

Abraham had led a life of following God, but he had not always completely trusted. He agreed to Sarah's misguided plan to have a son through Hagar. He allowed Sarah to be taken into a harem as his "sister" to try to save himself. Yet in the end, after finally receiving the blessing he always wanted, Abraham had learned that God was the faithful one. In this ultimate personal sacrifice, Abraham trusted God. He was able to respond in faith to the God who was his "shield and great reward," the God who would offer His own beloved Son instead of Abraham's, the God who brings life out of death.

Faithful God, I give thanks for Your blessings and put my trust in You. "I can do all things through Him who gives me strength."

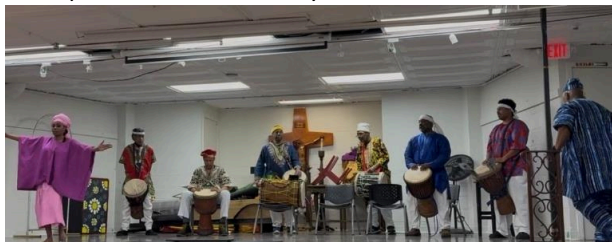
