1 Thessalonians 5:14 MSG

"We appeal to you, dear brothers and sisters, to instruct those who are not in their place of battle. Be skilled at gently encouraging those who feel themselves inadequate. Be faithful to stand your ground. Help the weak to stand again. Be quick to demonstrate patience with everyone."

- What is one specific step you can take this week to live that out with someone who's going through a rough time?

Please read **Mark 14:32-34** aloud.

- In the above passage, Jesus tells His closest friends that His soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. What does Jesus' willingness to share His deepest pain with His friends teach us about true friendship - and how might that challenge the way we open up to others today?

TALK IT OVER

Start praying: Be bold and pray with power.

Lord, we thank You for the example of Jesus, who welcomed others fully into His life. Help us to be bold in inviting others in sharing not just the easy moments, but also the hardest parts. Inspire us to lift one another up, just as You do, so that we reflect Your love and grace. Give us the humility to let others help us, and the courage to be real. May our friendships be a light, guiding each other toward hope in You. Amen.

Leader: Make time to pray for and with each other. Break into groups of three, take time for healing prayer or pray with individuals requesting prayer. This is important!

Start doing:

Galatians 6:1-3 MSG

"Live creatively, friends. If someone falls into sin, forgivingly restore him, saving your critical comments for yourself. You might be needing forgiveness before the day's out. Stoop down and reach out to those who are oppressed. Share their burdens, and so complete Christ's law. If you think you are too good for that, you are badly deceived."

Paul reminds us that showing up is not optional - it is Christlike love in action.
