Let's Dig Deeper

Someone read **Exodus 19:3-6**. Spend some time and share some key words that spoke out to you while reading. What is it about those words that spoke to you?

1. If being a blessing is your identity, how would someone close to you describe the way you live that out right now?
2. If someone watched your life Monday through Saturday, what would convince them that God is near to you... and what might make them doubt it?
3. Someone read **Exodus 19:3-6**. What does this passage say about both our identity and our role, and where do you see tension with how we often live that out?
4. Where have you subtly treated church as the destination instead of the place that prepares you for the real journey?
5. When you hear the phrase “*kingdom of priests*,” what part of that feels inspiring to you, and what part feels intimidating?
6. In what areas of your life have you unknowingly outsourced your priestly role to pastors, programs, or Sunday services?
7. Who has God already placed in your life where you may be the one He uses to connect them to Him?
8. In what ways has serving in the church strengthened your walk with God, and how might He be calling you to carry that same posture into everyday life?
9. Where do you see signs of ANTI-LIFE pressing in on your own heart, and what would it look like to respond as a priest instead of retreating or blending in?
10. What would change in your workplace, neighborhood, or friendships if you truly believed those spaces were sacred and not neutral?

11. When was the last time someone noticed something different about your life and asked you why, and what did you do with that moment?
12. What fears keep you from stepping into conversations where you might draw someone closer to God?
13. In what ways have you limited “ministry” to church buildings instead of seeing your everyday work as part of God’s mission?
14. What would it look like for you to live with greater nearness to God, not for your sake, but for the sake of others?
15. If God intends to use ordinary faithfulness to draw people out of ANTI-LIFE, what ordinary moment this week might actually matter more than you think?
