**Palm Sunday ~ Sunday, March 29, 2026, 10am**

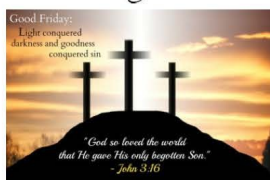
Christians remember the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday that marks the start of Holy week. We will consider what it meant for the people of Jesus who wanted him as messiah and what means to claim Jesus as Lord and King of our lives for today.



**Maundy Thursday ~ Thursday, April 2, 2026, 6am-4pm**

It was on the Thursday of Christ's final week before being crucified and resurrected that He said this commandment to His disciples. Jesus and his disciples had just shared what was known as the Last Supper and he was washing their feet when he stated:

*"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34).*
