SINGLE. DATING. FRIENDSHIPS. ROMANCE.

February in the youth group is all about relationships! God's plan for relationships has always been bigger than rules or a list of dos and don'ts; it's about reflecting His heart and inviting us into a new way of life. This series helps students see that relationships aren't random. They're one of God's most excellent tools for shaping our character and growing our faith. This series will challenge students to pursue singleness, friendship, dating, and romance in ways that honor God and point others to Him.

- **Session 1: Single (1 Corinthians 7:32-35)** | Singleness can feel complicated for students, be it in feeling overlooked or viewing singleness as a curse. Some might be asking the silent question: "What's wrong with me?" This session will challenge that mindset and show students that singleness isn't a problem to fix — it's a purpose to embrace.
- **Session 2: Friendship (Proverbs 13:20; Proverbs 27:17)** | Friendships play a massive role in a student's life. When friendships are going great, life feels great. When friendships get messy, everything can feel heavy. God's word offers timeless wisdom to help us build and keep healthy friendships that honor Him and strengthen us.
- **Session 3: Dating (Genesis 1:26-27; 1 Thessalonians 4:3-5)** | Here's the truth—it feels good to be liked and wanted! The struggle comes when students sacrifice conviction and wisdom to feel liked and wanted. In this session, students will learn that healthy dating starts with being whole in Christ first.
- **Session 4: Romance (Proverbs 5:1-18)** | In a world that treats romance like an impulse or reality game show, students are often left confused about what romance really means. This session invites students to see romance through a different lens - not as something driven by feelings or fueled by pressure, but as a way to reflect God's heart toward someone. Students will see that godly romance involves sacred freedoms that are worth cherishing as we cherish others through them.
