Youth Group Happenings

It's been an awesomely crazy January as we took our Middle School and High School students to Camp TimberLee for WinterXtreme in back-to-back weekends! We had 29 Middle School students go, and 12 High School students! We even had a handful of students go to camp for the very first time! A huge THANK YOU to Sara Slattengren, Julia Harris, Tarah and Gracee Holmgren, Jared Burke, and Mike Koolidge for their partnering in leadership on those weekends!

The theme of the weekends was "Unseen" and the focus was on 2 Corinthians 4:18, "We fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal." Pastor Josh Petersen walked our Middle School students

through Matthew 6 and Jesus' Sermon on the Mount to give us 4 points to remember about the seen versus the unseen. 1. Attention determines direction (we talked about how this works physically, mentally, and spiritually in our lives). 2. Applause will pause (this point was to encourage us to think about the audience we're trying to please). 3. You only live once forever (students were encouraged to think beyond our momentary time here, and ask what they wanted forever to look like). 4. There's a you in you that you can redo (this was a charge to students to experience renewal through trusting Jesus).

Our High Schoolers heard from Pastor James Maxwell, who kicked off the weekend by reminding students that we will not be free from trials, heartache, and grief here and now. However, we have a God who encourages us to bring everything to Him, and not hide from it. He then reminded students that faith that allows free will, necessitates an option to choose evil...but that evil is no match for God. Later we talked about what it looks like to rejoice in pain and suffering, like Peter wrote about. Students were reminded that Jesus doesn't leave us in those times. Finally, they were told that it's their turn to take action, and he challenged students to Depend on Christ, Delight in Christ, and to be Devoted to Christ.

I know this is a long update, but it's been a little while since I've updated and you have my sincere apologies for that. 41 students went to WinterXtreme, and that wasn't even everyone who regularly attends groups. Our youth groups are growing and thriving! It's very humbling, and a huge joy to have the trust and support of this church to be a part of what God is doing here! Please continue to pray for students as they come back from camp, and finish the school year!
