

Every month has its rhythms and milestones, but August stands apart.

And because kids matter to our church!

AWANA is a program that enriches all the lives it touches. From the 3 year olds finding themselves in maybe their first organized group, to the grandparents cheering the kids on and listening to them recite verses, there is a place for every person in the church.

PRAYER is, of course, essential to the success of this outreach.

FINANCES can help offset cost of the program (Families are asked for \$30 registration per child which will cover books and uniforms. But, there are also lots of little things, which add up, not covered by registration fees—supplies, snacks, AWANA award badges, etc.) Maybe you could help cover the gaps?

VOLUNTEERS—you've heard the phrase it takes a village to raise a child? The same holds true for AWANA. Many folks are needed to help our kids succeed. AWANA is mostly a ministry of presence. Teaching positions have been covered, but older students and adults need to be here to add structure and a listening ear to let our kids know they are a valuable asset to the family of God. Even 20 minutes of your time on a Thursday night means a lot to the kids.

FIRST BAPTIST BAKERY & BUFFET

GENERAL TSO'S CHICKEN

from the kitchen of Jordan & Jesse Smith

BAKED CHICKEN:

3 chicken breasts

½ cups flour

3 eggs—whisked

½ cups Panko

1. Preheat oven to 400°. Line baking sheet with foil and spray with nonstick.
2. Cube chicken, toss in flour, then whisked eggs. Finally toss in Panko. Coat evenly with each ingredient. Place on baking sheet and bake in oven until golden and crispy (10-12 minutes).

SAUCE:

Handful diced broccoli

½ cup brown sugar

½ cup soy sauce

½ cup orange juice

¼ cup + 2 Tbs rice vinegar

1 to 3 tsp sriracha (according to taste)

3 tsp minced garlic

½ tsp ginger

¼ cup + 2 Tbs vegetable oil

½ onion diced

3 Tbs cornstarch

¾ cup cold water

1. Whisk together brown sugar, soy sauce, orange juice, rice vinegar, sriracha and ginger in a bowl.

2. Heat vegetable oil and sauté onion. When onion is almost done, add the garlic.

3. Add broccoli and sauce mixture to pan. Cook until it begins to bubble.

4. In a bowl combine COLD water and cornstarch. Mix until no clumps. Pour slurry into sauce mixture and bring back to a boil, turn off heat once thickened.

5. Combine sauce with baked chicken. Enjoy.

ABW Bible Book of the Month

Exodus

The Book of Exodus is the second book of the Bible and continues the narrative from Genesis. It begins with the Israelites living in Egypt, where they have grown into a large nation. A new Pharaoh, who does not remember Joseph, enslaves them out of fear and imposes harsh labor. Despite Pharaoh's efforts, including a decree to kill all newborn Hebrew boys, one child—Moses—is miraculously saved and raised in Pharaoh's household.

God calls Moses through a burning bush and sends him back to Egypt to confront Pharaoh and lead the Israelites to freedom. Pharaoh resists, so God sends ten devastating plagues upon Egypt. After the final plague—the death of the firstborn—Pharaoh allows the Israelites to leave. This event is commemorated by the Passover, which becomes a key tradition in Jewish faith.

As the Israelites flee, Pharaoh changes his mind and pursues them. God parts the Red Sea, allowing the Israelites to cross safely and then drowns the Egyptian army. In the wilderness, the Israelites begin their journey to the Promised Land, but they quickly grumble and complain. God provides for them with manna from heaven, quail, and water from a rock.

At Mount Sinai, God gives the Israelites the Ten Commandments and other laws, forming a covenant that defines them as His chosen people. The people agree to obey, but soon break the covenant by worshiping a golden calf. Moses intercedes on their behalf, and God renews the covenant.

The rest of Exodus details instructions for building the Tabernacle, a portable sanctuary where God's presence will dwell with His people. The book ends with the completion of the Tabernacle and the glory of the Lord filling it, symbolizing God's ongoing guidance and presence with Israel.

Key themes include:

- God's power and faithfulness
- Deliverance and redemption
- Covenant and law
- Worship and God's presence among His people
