One of the freedoms the founding fathers intended was the freedom of religion. They believed that all men and women should be allowed to choose for themselves what to believe and how to worship. We are still benefitting from this freedom today.

As Jesus followers, we realize we are not free. We are captives in slavery to our sins. We find ourselves locked in evil's dark shackles unable to break its hold on us. We need a Savior to set us free.

JAMAICAN JUNGLE BREAD

from the kitchen of Nancy Schmidt

1 1/2 c. flour
 1 c. quick oats
 1/2 c. sugar
 1 t. baking soda
 1 t. baking powder
 1 t. cinnamon
 1/2 t. salt
 1/2 c. flaked coconut
 1/2 c. chopped nuts, toasted
 1 c. mashed bananas (3)
 8 oz. can crushed pineapple
 1/4 c. oil
 2 eggs

In a large bowl, stir together first nine dry ingredients. In another bowl, mix bananas, pineapple, oil, and eggs; add all at once to dry ingredients. Stir until just moistened. Pour into a greased 9x5x3-inch loaf pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 50-55 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool in pan 5 minutes; turn onto cooling rack and cool completely.

Glaze (optional)
 1/2 c. powdered sugar
 1 T. softened butter
 1/2 t. vanilla
 1-2 T. milk

Mix together and drizzle over warm bread.

ABW Bible Book of the Month
Song of Solomon

The *Song of Solomon*—also known as the *Song of Songs*—is a lyrical and poetic book found in the Old Testament, traditionally attributed to King Solomon. It is a unique work within the Bible, as it focuses entirely on love, romance, and desire between a bride (often identified as the Shulammite woman) and her beloved (commonly thought to be Solomon himself).

The book is composed of a series of poetic dialogues and monologues that vividly express mutual admiration, physical attraction, and the deep emotional longing between the lovers. The woman often takes the lead in expressing her desire and search for her beloved, while the man praises her beauty and speaks of his passion for her. The setting moves between palaces, gardens, and countryside scenes, reflecting the intimacy and natural imagery woven throughout the text.

Though there is no clear narrative structure, the recurring themes of separation and reunion, longing and fulfillment, create a rhythm that mirrors the ebb and flow of romantic love. The book does not mention God directly, which has led to varied interpretations over time.

Historically, Jewish and Christian traditions have often read the *Song of Solomon* allegorically. In Jewish tradition, it is viewed as an expression of the covenant love between God and Israel. In Christian theology, it has been interpreted as symbolic of the love between Christ and the Church.

Whether read as an allegory or a celebration of human love, the *Song of Solomon* affirms the beauty and sanctity of love, desire, and intimacy within a committed relationship. Its poetic language and evocative imagery continue to inspire reflection on the nature of love—both divine and human.

Ever wondered what taking 14 teenage girls on an adventure to an island for end of the year family time is like? It's so amazing to compare these precious girls now, to the excited kids who first arrived in dorm back in August. A year means a lot of growth and a year full of bonding, making mistakes, taking risks, being creative, challenging ourselves academically and physically, and building community. Proverbs 27:17 "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another."

We leave metro Manila traveling by school vans and ferry to Mindoro Island for a Dorm Family time each year. This outing is a fun getaway out in nature, including ocean activities, Philippine culture activities and a faith emphasis. This year it included an overnight hospital stay for Melissa as a medical emergency happened. These are the moments we realize how important you, our support team, is to us.

During Holy Week, the girls are in the dorm for 4 days straight. We tried to plan some good activities for the days of no school. We celebrated a Seder dinner on Thursday while some girls went on a ministry outreach. On Friday we visited Jose Rizal Park for a picnic lunch and later, rode some carnival rides at the Mall of Asia waterfront. The final day of Holy Week culminated at church for Resurrection Sunday!

We will be on home assignment August 2025 – July 2026. We have been asked by Tyndale Bible Translators and Faith Academy to gain strength in our financial partnerships by at least \$1500 more monthly to have all we need for healthy overseas ministry. Furlough is actually full of unknowns for housing and other details. Please pray for our peace and faith as we walk into the unknown.


