2 bananas
1 graham cracker pie crust, 9-inch
2 cups milk
8 ounces cream cheese, softened
1 package (3½ ounce) instant vanilla pudding mix

1. Slice bananas into crust.
2. Gradually add ½ cup milk to softened cream cheese, mixing until well blended.
3. Add remaining milk and pudding mix; beat slowly 1 minute.
4. Pour into crust; chill for about two hours.



ABW Bible Book of the Month

Ezekiel

The Book of Ezekiel is a prophetic book in the Old Testament that records the visions and messages of the prophet Ezekiel, who was among the Israelites exiled to Babylon in the 6th century BCE. The book is known for its vivid imagery, symbolic actions, and themes of judgment, restoration, and the glory of God.

The book can be divided into three major sections:

1. **Judgment on Judah and Jerusalem (Chapters 1–24)**
 - **Call of Ezekiel (Ch. 1–3):** Ezekiel has a vision of God's glory in a storm with four living creatures and a chariot-like throne. He is called to be a prophet to a rebellious Israel.
 - **Prophecies of Judgment (Ch. 4–7):** Ezekiel performs symbolic acts to illustrate the coming siege and destruction of Jerusalem.
 - **Vision of the Temple (Ch. 8–11):** Ezekiel sees the abominations in the temple, God's glory departing, and judgment on the corrupt leaders.
 - **Allegories of Judgment (Ch. 12–24):** Ezekiel uses parables and symbolic acts to warn about the certainty of destruction due to sin, idolatry, and corruption.
2. **Oracles Against the Nations (Chapters 25–32)**
 - Prophecies against Ammon, Moab, Edom, Philistia, Tyre, Sidon, and Egypt, emphasizing God's sovereignty over all nations and their judgment for opposing Israel.
3. **Future Restoration and Hope (Chapters 33–48)**
 - **The Watchman's Role (Ch. 33):** Ezekiel is reminded of his duty to warn the people.
 - **The Good Shepherd (Ch. 34):** God condemns corrupt leaders and promises to shepherd His people.
 - **Restoration of Israel (Ch. 36–37):** Includes the famous "Valley of Dry Bones" vision, symbolizing Israel's revival.
 - **Gog and Magog Prophecy (Ch. 38–39):** A symbolic battle between God and the forces of evil.
 - **The New Temple and Renewed Worship (Ch. 40–48):** Ezekiel sees a detailed vision of a restored temple, land, and the presence of God returning.

Key Themes

1. **God's Sovereignty** – God rules over nations and history.
2. **Judgment and Sin** – Israel's sins led to exile, but judgment is just.
3. **Hope and Restoration** – God promises to restore His people spiritually and physically.
4. **God's Presence** – His glory departs due to sin but will return in the future.

Ezekiel's prophecies shaped Jewish thought and Christian eschatology, influencing apocalyptic literature and visions of God's kingdom.

We are so proud of our daughters! They all did very well last semester in school and we are continually amazed by their hard work and dedication. Hungarian high school students are required to complete a number of volunteer service hours before graduating and last year Ruth found a meaningful way to give back – by offering free English lessons at our local library on Saturdays. It quickly became a popular program drawing students and parents, and even some adult learners who were eager to practice their English. In this part of Hungary opportunities to converse with native English speakers are rare, so people truly appreciate the time and effort the girls give.

This year, Maggie, now a freshman in high school, is joining Ruth in tutoring sessions one hour with adults, another with kids, while Ruth continues offering private lessons for those who sign up. Because both girls speak Hungarian, they can explain concepts clearly, making the sessions even more valuable for their students.

We are so thankful that our daughters not only excel in their studies, but also embrace the opportunity to serve. Their willingness to share time and talents is a beautiful reflection of God's love in action. Please pray for them as they continue this work that they would be a blessing to their students and grow through the experience as well. Ruth will accompany Larry on his next visit to Serbia, visiting friends and serving as his interpreter. Thank you for your continued support and prayers for our family and ministry!
