

# MARCH 2026 BIBLE LESSON PLANS

## Monthly Theme: The Miracles of Jesus

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### MARCH 1, 2026 — JESUS CALMS THE STORM

**Theme:** Trusting Jesus When We Are Afraid

#### Scripture

Mark 4:39

#### Memory Verse

“Even the wind and the waves obey him!” — Mark 4:41

#### Game (Small Area): Calm the Storm

Have children spread out in a small area. Begin by having them gently move like waves while you make quiet wind sounds. Gradually increase the movement and sound to represent a storm. When the leader says, “Peace, be still,” everyone must freeze and sit down quietly. Repeat several times. After the game, talk about how Jesus has power over storms and can bring peace when we are afraid.

#### Craft: Storm in a Bottle

Children fill a clear bottle with water and glitter. Shake it to make a “storm,” then watch it settle. Write “Jesus brings peace” on the bottle.

#### Interactive Choose-the-Path Story

Jesus and His disciples climb into a boat to cross the lake. At first, the water is calm, and the boat gently rocks back and forth. Jesus lies down and falls asleep.

Suddenly, dark clouds fill the sky. Wind begins to howl. Waves splash into the boat, and the disciples feel scared.

**Decision 1:** What should the disciples do when the storm gets worse?

- A. Shout and panic
- B. Try to fix everything themselves
- C. Wake Jesus

Shouting and panicking makes the storm feel scarier, but nothing changes. Trying to fix everything alone doesn't stop the waves either.

Waking Jesus brings hope.

The disciples rush to Jesus and wake Him up.

**Decision 2:** What should they say to Jesus?

- A. "We trust You."
- B. "Why are You sleeping?"
- C. Hide quietly in the boat

Hiding quietly doesn't help, and blaming Jesus doesn't calm their hearts.

Choosing to trust Jesus shows faith.

Jesus stands up and speaks to the wind and waves.

**Decision 3:** How should the disciples respond now?

- A. Watch and trust
- B. Jump out of the boat
- C. Argue with each other

Arguing or jumping out only causes more fear.

Watching and trusting lets them see Jesus' power.

**Ending:**

The storm stops. The water becomes calm. The disciples realize that Jesus has power over everything—and they can trust Him even when they are afraid.

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## **MARCH 8, 2026 — JESUS FEEDS THE FIVE THOUSAND**

**Theme:** Jesus Provides What We Need

## Scripture

John 6:11

## Memory Verse

“Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them.” — John 6:11

## Game (Small Area): Share the Lunch

Give each child a paper “loaf” or “fish.” Some children will have more than others. Explain that the goal is to make sure everyone has something by sharing. Pause to discuss how sharing helps meet everyone’s needs, just like the boy who shared his lunch.

## Craft: Basket of Blessings

Children decorate a paper basket and draw food inside it. Write “Jesus provides” on the basket.

## Interactive Choose-the-Path Story

A huge crowd has gathered to hear Jesus teach. The sun is going down, and people’s stomachs begin to rumble.

The disciples notice the crowd is hungry.

**Decision 1:** What should the disciples suggest?

- A. Send everyone away
- B. Ignore the problem
- C. See what food is available

Sending people away leaves them hungry, and ignoring the problem doesn’t help.

Looking for what food is available is the next step.

A young boy steps forward with five loaves and two fish.

**Decision 2:** What should they do with the food?

- A. Hide it because it’s not enough
- B. Bring it to Jesus
- C. Eat it themselves

Hiding or eating it helps only a few people.

Bringing it to Jesus shows faith.

Jesus takes the food in His hands.

**Decision 3:** What happens next?

- A. Jesus thanks God
- B. The disciples worry
- C. Everyone argues

Worrying and arguing stop faith from growing.

Jesus thanks God and begins to break the bread.

**Ending:**

There is enough food for everyone—and leftovers too. Jesus shows that when we trust Him with what we have, He provides more than enough.

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## **MARCH 15, 2026 — JESUS HEALS THE LEPER**

**Theme:** Jesus Shows Compassion

### **Scripture**

Mark 1:41

### **Memory Verse**

“Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man.” — Mark 1:41

### **Game (Small Area): Reach Out and Help**

Have children sit in a circle. Place an object just out of reach in the middle. One at a time, invite a child to stand and gently reach out to pick it up and bring it back. Discuss how Jesus reached out to help people others avoided.

### **Craft: Compassion Hearts**

Children cut out a heart and draw or write ways they can show kindness to people who feel left out.

## Interactive Choose-the-Path Story

A man with leprosy stands far away from others. He has been sick for a long time and feels lonely.

He sees Jesus walking by.

**Decision 1:** What should the man do?

- A. Hide because he is ashamed
- B. Walk away
- C. Ask Jesus for help

Hiding or walking away keeps him alone and sick.

Asking Jesus for help shows courage and faith.

The man kneels and asks Jesus to make him clean.

**Decision 2:** How should he respond when Jesus comes closer?

- A. Pull away in fear
- B. Trust Jesus
- C. Yell for help

Pulling away or yelling stops the moment.

Trusting Jesus allows compassion to flow.

Jesus reaches out His hand.

**Decision 3:** What happens next?

- A. The man accepts Jesus' touch
- B. He runs away
- C. He refuses help

Running away or refusing stops healing.

Accepting Jesus' touch brings healing.

**Ending:**

Jesus heals the man and shows that no one is too broken or forgotten for His love.

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## MARCH 22, 2026 — JESUS HEALS THE BLIND MAN

**Theme:** Jesus Helps Us See

## Scripture

John 9:25

## Memory Verse

“I was blind but now I see.” — John 9:25

## Game (Small Area): Trust Walk

Pair children together. One child closes their eyes while the other gently guides them using only their voice. Switch roles and discuss trusting Jesus to guide us.

## Craft: Seeing Clearly Glasses

Children decorate paper glasses and write “Jesus helps me see.”

## Interactive Choose-the-Path Story

A blind man sits beside the road. He hears people talking about Jesus.

**Decision 1:** What should he do?

- A. Stay quiet
- B. Cry out to Jesus
- C. Move away

Staying quiet or moving away keeps him blind.

Crying out shows faith.

Jesus stops and speaks to him.

**Decision 2:** How should the man respond?

- A. Obey Jesus
- B. Argue
- C. Walk away

Arguing or walking away stops healing.

Obeying Jesus shows trust.

The man follows Jesus' instructions.

**Ending:**

The man can see for the first time. Jesus shows that He brings light and understanding.

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## **MARCH 29, 2026 — JESUS RAISES LAZARUS**

**Theme:** Jesus Has Power Over Death

### **Scripture**

John 11:43

### **Memory Verse**

“I am the resurrection and the life.” — John 11:25

### **Game (Small Area): Roll Away the Stone**

Children work together to move a lightweight object representing the stone. Talk about obedience and teamwork.

### **Craft: Empty Tomb Picture**

Children draw an open tomb and write “Jesus gives life.”

### **Interactive Choose-the-Path Story**

Lazarus is very sick. His sisters send for Jesus.

**Decision 1:** How should they feel while waiting?

- A. Trust Jesus
- B. Panic
- C. Blame others

Panicking or blaming brings sadness but no hope.

Trusting Jesus brings peace.

Lazarus dies before Jesus arrives.

**Decision 2:** What should the sisters do when Jesus comes?

- A. Walk away
- B. Talk to Jesus
- C. Hide

Walking away or hiding stops hope.

Talking to Jesus opens the door to faith.

Jesus goes to the tomb.

**Decision 3:** What should the people do?

- A. Refuse to help
- B. Roll away the stone
- C. Leave

Refusing or leaving blocks the miracle.

Rolling away the stone shows obedience.

**Ending:**

Jesus calls Lazarus out of the tomb. Lazarus lives again. Jesus shows He has power over life and death.
