It is mandated that somewhere around five years old we must go to school. Whether you get up each weekday and journey to the local schoolhouse or are Home-schooled, the process begins. First, we learn that the box of crayons is used to draw pictures on the paper and not the wall. Then we learn the alphabet, how to read and the various subjects like Mathematics, Science and History. In some areas we excel and in others we may struggle. Over the years we are continually asked what we want to be when we grow up. Although most of us don't have an answer to that question, we respond with something just to get past the moment. In High School I began to give more thought as to my future. My grades were not bad, but they weren't great either. I wanted to apply to one of the better schools because I had heard somewhere if you have a degree from a prestigious University getting a good job and salary was a piece of cake. Neither of my parents graduated from college but was very successful. One night at dinner I asked them what is the best way to get into a good school. My Dad said I need to buckle down and get my grades to at least a solid B-level. Well, that was going to take more work than I was willing to invest. I then asked my School Counselor for some advice. She said, good grades are the preferred way. She then asked if I excelled at any sport. Sports Scholarships were available and a good way to get accepted into a good School but you must do the work to stay there. Earlier in the year I tried to get on the School's basketball and soccer teams because the Guys at school really like Guys who walked around in their letterman jackets. The reality is I really suck at sports. I then asked the Counselor what my other options were. She asked was I involved with any social groups in the private sector or at my Church. I said no. My time is too valuable to be involved with anything like that. She looked at me and shook her head. She then explained that before some institution will invest their funds in you they want assurances they have invested wisely and that means having a record of service toward something positive whether it is good grades or involved in helping the community. That weekend I took a hard look at myself. Increasing my grade point average was possible but to raise it significantly was unlikely. It finally dawned on me that in order to help myself, I need to commit to helping others. The cool thing is when you are actively looking to help someone, there is a plethora of things you can do. My Parents were on board but made the stipulation that school comes first during the week and Church is non-negotiable on Sunday. To ensure I was off work on Sundays I got a job at Chick-fil-a. The job was really cool but just saying "my pleasure" when the Customer says thank you really helps no one. I mentioned this to my Dad and he asked me to consider helping out at the Homeless Shelter downtown. The first couple of weeks were pretty boring because all I did was work in the storeroom stocking shelves. Then things suddenly changed. One of the other Workers got sick and couldn't come to work and I was asked to man the counter. This may sound silly, but for the first time it dawned on me that Homeless Shelters were full of people who not only lacked somewhere else to live, but in many ways were stripped of hope. Over the months which followed I heard a lot of personal stories. There was one family who was homeless because there was a major fire in the apartment complex they resided which was totally destroyed. They are waiting to move into a new place but the list they are on is so long. Another family had twin boys who were special needs children and the parents said they have been evicted several times because the nature of their disability causes them to get easily agitated and violent. One day I was helping a young man do some research online for a book report. After, I invited him to our upcoming Church Youth Rally. He said no thank you because "God doesn't like me". I asked him why he felt that way and he said his family was homeless because their community was destroyed by a forest fire which was caused by lightning which is an act of God. I wasn't sure how to respond. My Church invests a lot toward Sunday School to help us build a spiritual foundation. We are taught that God is in charge and although something we don't like happens, this doesn't mean God no longer loves us. How do I convince a young boy living in a Shelter that God still loves him? I was there to help but at the end of the day I wasn't sure if God put me here for him or God put him there for me.

One of the pitfalls many fall into today is they continually reach their hand in the pot to draw out something of value but they hesitate put anything in. Great investments begin with a willing contribution.
