Sermon Summary

Jesus Transfigured (Luke 9:28–36)

Summary: Jesus was transfigured to reveal his glory as the Christ of God, the crucified Lord, so that his disciples may live in imitation of him.

The background event of Jesus' Transfiguration: his prediction of what will happen to him as the Christ of God—his crucifixion and resurrection.

The Son of Man must suffer many things...be killed and on the third day be raised to life... If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. (Luke 9:23)

The event of Jesus being transfigured on the mountain is intended to teach his disciples the meaning of his crucifixion and discipleship in imitating him crucified (Lk. 9:22-23).

First, Jesus revealed his divine image as the Christ of God.

As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning (Luke 9:29).

Jesus is a man of humility, being called the man of Nazareth. He will get through the most miserable and shameful thing in his time, which is the crucifixion. His transfiguration presents his heavenly image, his original image as the Son of God.

The Crucifixion itself is the revelation of the glory and power hidden in the humble image of Jesus as the Christ of God.

No, we speak of God's secret wisdom, a wisdom that has been hidden and that God destined for our glory before time began. None of the rulers of this age understood it, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. (1 Cor. 2:7-8)

Christ of God will reveal his glory and power on the cross. God is glorified not only through his resurrection but also his crucifixion.

The disciples are those who have seen the glory of God revealed in Christ the crucified Lord.

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. We have seen the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John 1:14)

For the disciples, the cross of Christ is the power and wisdom of God. Crucifixion is not a defeatism but triumphalism. Christ the crucified Lord is our boasting.

Second, the Crucifixion is the Fulfillment of the Word of God

Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendor, talking with Jesus. They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem.” (Lk. 9:30-31)

The subject matter of the conversation between Moses and Elijah was the departure of Jesus from the world: the crucifixion would accomplish what the whole Scripture promises and testifies.

The Gospel of God is “the gospel he promised beforehand through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures regarding his Son” (Rom. 1:2).

Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us (Luke 1:1)

The Gospel of Luke is the record of “the things that have been fulfilled among us” through Christ (Luke 1:1). Jesus’ crucifixion has accomplished what the prophets, Moses, and Elijah had spoken: God’s promise of salvation is accomplished through the crucifixion of Christ.

Jesus is the key to understanding the whole Scripture:

What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ. (Phil. 3:8)

A. Discipleship: Listening to Christ through the Word of God

A voice came from the cloud, saying, “This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him.” (Luke 9:35)

We can experience the glory of Christ revealed in the Word of God.

The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. (2 Cor. 4:4)

Our reading and study of the Word of God leads us to the knowledge of Christ and to discipleship. When we listen to the Word of God, Jesus Christ is sanctified and honored as the Son of God within us.

B. Discipleship – Imitating Christ crucified: we are called to participate in the suffering of Christ

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death. (Phil. 3:10)

This is the main reason Jesus took his disciples to the mountain and showed them his glory: Jesus should give up his power and authority to the cross and be raised from the dead. Likewise, his disciples should deny themselves, take up their own crosses, and live imitating Christ, the crucified Lord. We are called to live in self-effacement and self-denial for the glory of Christ. God will not forget our works for the kingdom of God and reward us with eternal life and glory.
