Knowing God in Scripture	Children will learn that the Bible tells us who God is. It is trustworthy and we follow it. They will memorize 48 verses (one key verse each month) while being specifically exposed to over 200 (one key verse pertaining to the lesson specifically each week).	The Word of God leads us to the Person of God. Exploring the entire Bible, kids will see God's nature revealed through every book. The Holy Spirit empowers us through the word of God to live wisely. There are people who don't know Jesus so God is advancing His Kingdom here, there, and everywhere. Every person matters to God because of His image in people and He has a plan to reconcile all people by the Blood of Jesus. All of us are called to be kingdom advancers with global impact, bringing all of Jesus to all the world.	God has made you to bring Him Glory and be a benefit to others. His desire is to bring the message of the gospel of the kingdom to every place of brokenness and influence.
