

## 2026-02-15 Discussion Questions

The pastor distinguishes between 'believing in God' and 'believing God'—what does this difference mean in your daily life, and which category do you honestly fall into?

When God speaks through His Word and asks you to change something, do you respond with 'I'll try' or with complete surrender, and what holds you back from full obedience?

The sermon emphasizes that faith without action is dead—can you identify an area in your life where you claim faith but haven't taken any corresponding action?

How does the concept of being created 'in God's image' as someone who should 'make a good example' challenge the way you represent Christ to others?

The pastor asks if we're living 'with Christ' or 'for Christ'—what would need to change in your life to shift from coexistence to living fully for Him?

James 1:22 warns against merely listening to the Word without doing it, thereby deceiving ourselves—what truth have you heard repeatedly but failed to act upon?

The story of Abraham and Sarah waiting for God's promise when it seemed impossible raises the question: where in your life do you need to trust God despite circumstances that seem dead or dried up?

If being blessed requires looking intently into God's Word and continually changing rather than just asking for blessings, what specific changes is God calling you to make right now?

The pastor mentions that we're often more willing to trust Google than God's Word—what does this reveal about where you place your ultimate authority and trust?

How would your witness and authenticity as a Christian change if you truly believed you'll stand before Jesus alone to account for what you did with the faith you claimed to have?
