

2026-02-22 Discussion Questions

Jesus told Nicodemus that being born again means a complete transformation in how we understand life. What does this transformation look like practically in your daily life, and are you experiencing ongoing spiritual development?

The sermon emphasizes that salvation is not a one-time event but an ongoing developmental process. Where would you honestly say you are in your spiritual development—still at conception, birth, or actively maturing?

The pastor challenges the idea of easy believism by asking if we truly comprehend that our sins killed Jesus. How does recognizing your personal responsibility for Christ's death change your understanding of salvation?

In the parable of the sower, Jesus describes four types of soil representing different responses to God's word. Which soil best represents your current spiritual condition, and what needs to change for you to produce a lasting crop?

The sermon asks why we give the world our best but not Jesus, and why we skip church for things we would never skip work for. What does your actual behavior reveal about whether Christ is truly your highest priority?

The woman who washed Jesus' feet with her tears demonstrated extravagant love because she recognized how much she had been forgiven. Do you love Jesus much or only a little, and what does that reveal about your awareness of your own sin?

Simon the leper was healed by Jesus but still looked down on the sinful woman, showing little love. How can we avoid the trap of minimizing our own sin while judging others, especially after experiencing God's grace?

The pastor states that we show ourselves by whether we talk about Christ openly or avoid it because it is controversial. What does your willingness or reluctance to speak about Jesus reveal about the authenticity of your faith?

Jesus said that whoever does not bear fruit will be cut off from the vine. What specific fruit is evident in your life that demonstrates you are genuinely connected to Christ and developing spiritually?

The sermon challenges us to ask when we last changed something or stretched beyond our abilities for Jesus. What is one area where God is prompting you to surrender or sacrifice something for His glory right now?
