Jesus commands us to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us - who in your life falls into this category, and are you willing to genuinely pray for them?

How does Romans 13's teaching that all governing authorities are established by God challenge or confirm your current perspective on submission and respect?

In what areas of your life have you allowed your emotions and team loyalties to obscure your perspective and hinder your witness for Christ?

What would change in your daily interactions if you truly embraced the call to 'give God the glory in everything' rather than defending your position or

team?
