Monday – Loved by Jesus

Scripture Reading: John 15:9

Reflection: Jesus begins with a profound truth: we are loved by Him with the same love the Father has for Him. Selfless love flows not from effort, but from abiding in Christ's love.

Reflection Questions:

1. What does it mean to be loved by Jesus personally?
2. How does knowing I am deeply loved change the way I love others?
3. Where do I struggle to believe or receive Christ's love?

Prayer: *Jesus, thank You for loving me with a perfect and unfailing love. Help me to rest in Your love and let it shape how I treat others. Teach me to love from a place of being loved. Amen.*

Tuesday – Abiding in Love Through Obedience

Scripture Reading: John 15:10; 1 John 5:1–3

Reflection: Obedience is not about earning love but remaining in it. When we obey Jesus, we choose to stay rooted in His love and reflect it through our lives.

Reflection Questions:

1. How does obedience express love for Jesus?
2. In what areas is God calling me to trust Him more fully?
3. How does obedience protect and deepen friendship with Christ?

Prayer: *Lord, help me to walk in joyful obedience. Not out of fear, but out of love. Teach me to trust Your commands as expressions of Your care for me. Amen.*

Wednesday – Joy in Selfless Love

Scripture Reading: John 15:11; Acts 20:32–35

Reflection: Jesus promises that selfless love leads to true joy. When we give ourselves away in love, we experience the fullness of life Christ offers.

Reflection Questions:

1. Where do I find joy—giving or receiving?
2. How have I experienced joy through serving or loving others?
3. What might God be inviting me to give this week?

Prayer: *Jesus, fill my heart with Your joy. Teach me that real joy comes from loving and serving others. Help me to live generously and selflessly. Amen.*

Thursday – Loving One Another as Christ Loved Us

Scripture Reading: John 15:12; Philippians 2:3–4

Reflection: Jesus sets the standard for love: love others as He has loved us. His love is patient, humble, and sacrificial.

Reflection Questions:

1. How has Jesus loved me in practical ways?
2. Who in my life needs to experience Christ's love through me?
3. What does selfless love look like in my relationships?

Prayer: *Lord, teach me to love others as You have loved me. Give me compassion, patience, and humility. Let my life reflect Your love in tangible ways. Amen.*

Friday – Greater Love Has No One Than This

Scripture Reading: John 15:13; Romans 5:6–8

Reflection: The greatest expression of love is sacrifice. Jesus defines love not by words, but by laying down His life for us.

Reflection Questions:

1. What does sacrificial love mean in my context?
2. What comforts or preferences might God be calling me to lay down?
3. How does Jesus' sacrifice shape the way I love others?

Prayer: *Jesus, thank You for laying down Your life for me. Teach me to love with a sacrificial heart, willing to give of myself for the good of others. Amen.*

Saturday – Friends of Jesus

Scripture Reading: John 15:14; James 2:20–24

Reflection: Jesus calls us friends, not servants. Friendship with Christ is rooted in love, trust, and shared purpose.

Reflection Questions:

1. What does it mean to be called a friend of Jesus?
2. How does friendship with Christ shape my identity?
3. How can I reflect Christ's friendship to others?

Prayer: *Lord Jesus, thank You for calling me Your friend. Help me walk closely with You in love and obedience. Teach me to reflect Your friendship and sacrificial love to the world. Amen*
