FOX CREEK ELEMENTARY SUPPLY DRIVE FOR FEBRUARY

As many of you know, Second Pres supports Fox Creek Elementary School with Promise Council of McLean county through teacher lunches, supply drives, and more. This month, we have been asked to help support Fox Creek Elementary by gathering supplies to protect their classrooms during flu season. Currently, teachers and classrooms are in need of facial tissues, cleaning wipes, and disinfectant spray (such as Lysol). Student and teacher health is essential to a successful school day, and these supplies will help to keep classrooms germ free.



In addition to these supplies, the school is also asking for donations of gently used children's chapter or picture books. Many of the students at Fox Creek Elementary have few books at home, and the Little Free Library is a vital source of reading materials to these students.




JOIN CHAPEL CHOIR FOR THE LENTEN SEASON!





FROM THE HERITAGE ARCHIVES Greenland Revisited




**Paul R. Nelson, M.D.,
U.S. Army Air Corps
Term of Service:
December 1941-1945
Main Duty: Greenland**

In 2010 a collective story from church members who served in World War II was undertaken through interviews. One of our veterans, Dr. Paul Nelson served most of his duty in Greenland. Here is what Paul had to say.

In 1941, when it happened, I was a sophomore in medical school. And we thought, "Oh, my gosh, will we be taken right out of school?" We were offered a choice of going into the uniform, staying in school or taking your chance to be drafted. I decided to go into the service. Most of the service I spent in Greenland. And that as a very, well, it's hard to describe it. There were a few men there but an awful lot of snow and cold weather.

We would see people going through Greenland on the way from the battle in Europe. There was a pretty good hospital in Greenland. Some of them would stay there for awhile before they went back to the States. I was in Greenland for about three weeks. I got my orders to go to an outpost in Ikateq, Greenland where there were fifteen men, one other officer and myself. We were on the east coast of Greenland on afjord about five miles from the Arctic Circle. I have pictures that show where we were.

They had a big hospital but there was only one other officer and myself and I had one helper. We didn't have much in the way of hospital care. The hospital was I think a hundred beds, but we only used one or two rooms and had very few people in the hospital at any one time. We had fellas that would injure themselves. We didn't have anybody shooting at us but if you look at some of those pictures you can see that it was a pretty rough place to be. It was just an outpost for weather. Weather was predicted for Europe from Greenland. I was there for almost a year.



When we heard about VE Day, we thought right away we were going home. But it didn't happen that way. We were in for awhile afterwards.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Financial Summary through December 31, 2025 - Actuals compared to the Annual Budget

Contributions are favorable compared to the annual budget by \$43,089. Other Receipts are favorable being \$67,4036 greater than the annual budget and include \$80,516 transferred from Foundation for the door repairs and sanctuary caulk repairs. Additionally, during 2025 the church received a generous estate gift of \$19,989 and \$200,000 of the budgeted Foundation support was needed to support church operations. Expenses are unfavorable as they are \$86,212 greater than the annual budget and include \$33,125 spent to fix the Prairie Street and Jefferson Street doors, \$47,391 spent to repair the caulk around the sanctuary stone and \$23,811.57 to repair/upgrade the Martin Hall fire safe doors. This provides a \$5,731 unfavorable variance for 2025. The 2025 annual budget includes a \$51,214 deficit.

Stewardship Sunday was Sunday, September 7th. As of January 20th, the church collected 137 stewardship cards totaling \$877,494. It is never too late to turn in a pledge. Thank you for continuing your gifts and supporting our mission.
