BATTLE POINT

Faith interprets reality with God.




ACTION STEP

Identify one area of fear in your life and write down one promise of God that speaks directly to it.

ICEBREAKER - *What is a lighthearted example of a time when two people saw the same situation but interpreted it completely differently.*

THE TWELVE SPIES. READ NUMBERS 13:21-33

- The twelve spies saw the same land, the same fruit, and the same giants. What was the real difference between the ten and Joshua & Caleb?
- The Israelites had already seen the Red Sea parted, manna fall, and God's presence among them. Why do you think they still gave in to fear?
- Hebrews 3:19 says they were unable to enter because of unbelief. What does this story teach us about how seriously God takes unbelief?
- What does this teach us about the connectedness of fear and unbelief?

PARALLAX & PERSONAL REFLECTION.

- Where in your life right now are you tempted to see “giants” instead of seeing God?
- What are some practical “tools for belief” God has given you that you sometimes neglect (Scripture, prayer, worship, community, etc.)?
- What is one specific area this week where you need to choose faith over fear?

DIGGING DEEPER: CHURCH FAMILY REFLECTIONS

In Numbers 13, Israel stood at the edge of a new season. The land was real. The giants were real. But so were the promises of God. As our church steps into The Next Corner (or any next step your church may take if you do not attend TCC), we may find ourselves at a similar moment. Every church that enters a new season will face challenges. The question is not whether obstacles exist, but how we will interpret them. Will we respond with fear like the ten spies, or faith like Joshua and Caleb? What would it look like for us to say together, “If the Lord is with us, we are able”?

- As our church considers The Next Corner (or if your church considers change), what are some “giants” that might cause fear?
- What would it look like for us, to respond like Joshua and Caleb instead of the ten spies?
- How can we guard against group fear becoming group unbelief?
