Declaration of Dependency

America celebrates their independence from Britain on the 4th of July every year. We declare our freedom on this day. God wants us to declare our dependence on Him every day of our life. With all the problems and difficulties in our lives, we need God's help desperately. Living without the support of God is the life of failure. I have many Scripture verses today that show us that God wants us to be dependent on Him. When we live in His power and support, life gets much easier to live. Let's read Psalms 23 to start with, and we can see how David was able to do all the great things that God wanted him to do while he was alive on planet earth.

Psalm 23:1-6 KJV The Lord is my Shepherd; I shall not want. [2] He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: He leadeth me beside the still waters. [3] He restoreth my soul: He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake. [4] Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me. [5] Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: Thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. [6] Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

Is this psalm we see David over and over again making faith declarations. Look at verse one; David said, "the Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want". I can just imagine David looking at the sheep he was entrusted with, knowing that he was their help and provider, and then thinking about the Lord being his shepherd. David knew that he would always protect and provide for his sheep; that was what his life was about. I can just see him sitting on a rock and singing this psalm about his Lord being his protection and provision. We can learn a lot from David; he believed that God was responsible for his well-being. If we could just see that God wants a relationship with us like David had.

We must learn how to depend on our Father God. In today's Newsletter, I believe I have a revelation that will help you finally become completely dependent on your Father God.

Romans 3:25-26 KJV Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in His blood, to declare His righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God; [26] To declare, I say, at this time His righteousness: that He might be just, and the justifier of him which believeth in Jesus.

In these verses we see that God is making declarations. I've thought about the Declaration of Independence many times in my life as an American. Today I am an American citizen because of the men that made a Declaration of Independence from Britain. It was a hard-fought war that won us our independence, so that today we can declare that we are not British citizens; but we are Americans. When we separated from Britain, we had to then supply for and defend ourselves. When Adam sinned in the garden, he made the human race independent from God. Well guess what? A new day has come; our independent days are over! We are now Citizens with the saints and the household of God.

Ephesians 2:19 KJV Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God;

We have to learn how to be dependent on God. I've learned the way this happens is by making faith declarations that are founded in the Bible. The Christian Center's Confession Booklet is made up of Biblical declarations. As we speak them in faith, we will start having our minds become dependent on our Creator, Father God. So let's get busy and start boldly declaring God's promises over our lives!
