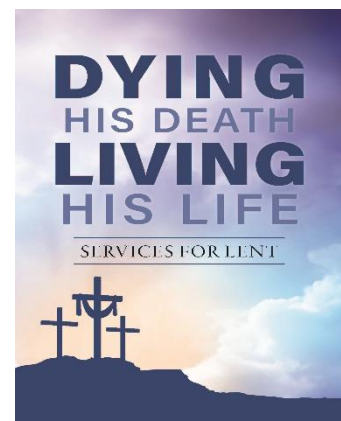
These services continue every Wednesday through March also.

From Pastor Hahn

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace, mercy, and peace be to you from God our Father and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is difficult to believe that it has been 2 years I've been serving you as your Pastor at St. Matthew Lutheran. It has truly been a blessing for me. As I look at my third year it is full of excitement and possibility. Strategic Planning is an incredible task as we look to the future of St Matthew Lutheran. What will things look like 5 years from now? I don't know, but I do know that God Is Good!

As we enter the holy season of Lent, I invite you to join me in a time of reflection, repentance, and spiritual renewal. Lent is a sacred journey—a forty-day pilgrimage that prepares our hearts and minds for the celebration of our Lord's resurrection on Easter Sunday.

In the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), Lent is a time set apart to remember the sacrifice of Jesus, to acknowledge our own need for forgiveness, and to recommit ourselves to faithful living. This season begins with Ash Wednesday, when we receive the sign of the cross in ashes, hearing the words, ***“Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”*** These solemn words remind us of our mortality and our utter dependence on God's grace.

Lent is not merely a time of somberness; it is ultimately a season of hope. As we confess our sins and shortcomings, we do so in the confidence that God is ***“gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love”*** (Joel 2:13). Through the cross and empty tomb, Jesus has secured forgiveness and new life for all who trust in Him. Let this assurance move us to deeper faith, greater love for one another, and bold witness in our community.

As we journey together through these forty days, let us keep our eyes fixed on the joy that awaits us on Easter morning. Christ's victory over sin and death is our victory, too. May this Lenten season be a time of blessing for you and your family—a time to grow in faith, hope, and love as we await the resurrection celebration.

May the peace of Christ guard your hearts and minds throughout this holy season.

The Lenten Season begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18th. You are encouraged to attend the 6:30 p.m. special Mid-Week Lenten Services. This year's theme throughout Lent is ***“Dying His Death, Living His Life”***. In this series of special worship services for Lent, we are reminded that we are buried with Christ in His death so that we might live with Him in His resurrection. The old is gone. The new has come. Each day affords us a chance to die to self and live for Him. In word and song, we contemplate those things that were put to death on the cross so that we might receive the blessings of new life in Christ.

(Like last year, the 8th Grade Confirmation Class will be assisting with these Services throughout Lent.)

Adult Small Group Sunday Morning Bible Study

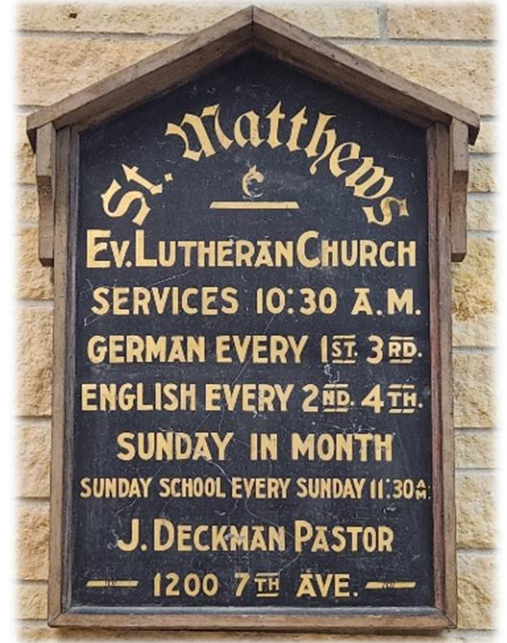

His father stepped in to take his place and ended up serving until he was 72 years old! He served from WWI through the 1920s and into the depression. What stories would be told?



MUSIC AND WORSHIP NEWS

As I write this newsletter article, we are barely into the season of Epiphany. But by the time you receive this newsletter, Ash Wednesday and Lent will be only a couple of weeks away.

What is the purpose of this upcoming Lenten season? Lent is observed to prepare our hearts for Holy Week and Easter by contemplating Jesus's life, suffering, death, and resurrection, and recognizing our need for salvation. Lent lasts for 40 days, not counting Sundays. It begins on Ash Wednesday (February 18th this year) and ends on Holy Saturday (the day before Easter).

Some of the symbolism associated with Lent include the following:

- Ash Wednesday: Ashes placed on the forehead at our Ash Wednesday service remind us of our sinful nature and our mortality. (Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.)
- Purple: The liturgical color of purple signifies repentance and royalty.
- Silence: We omit the "Hymn of Praise" and the "Alleluia" in our liturgy and choose hymns and worship songs that do not include the word "Alleluia" until Easter.

Some of the common practices followed by Christians during the season of Lent include:

- Prayer: Increased time in daily devotion and prayer.
- Fasting/Abstinence: Giving up worldly pleasure to focus on Christ and His atoning sacrifice.
- Almsgiving: Acts of charity shown to others to remind us of Christ's ultimate act of love for all of us.

Lent is a spiritual journey of dying to sin and rising to new life in Christ. Please join us in worship throughout this 40-day journey. Worship, prayer, and spending time in God's Word daily throughout the season of Lent will make Easter Sunday even more meaningful for all of us.

Greetings, Happy February! This is a month that may remind us of love and symbols of love, a heart and a cross! A scripture that relates to God's great love for us comes from Matthew 22:37-40. An expert of the law tested Jesus by asking Him what is the greatest commandment in the Law? Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments. The type of love Jesus is referring to is agapo/agape. A devotion that is directed by the will and can be commanded as a duty. It is a selfless, unconditional love.

One of the symbols of love is the heart. We see cartoon images with warm, loving messages. You may see a cupid with his arrows and a heart. In February we recognize Heart Health Month. Our heart is a vital organ for keeping us alive. Our heart beats approximately 100,000 times a day, pumping roughly 2,000 gallons of blood throughout our body per day. It is a very strong muscle that never stops to take a rest! 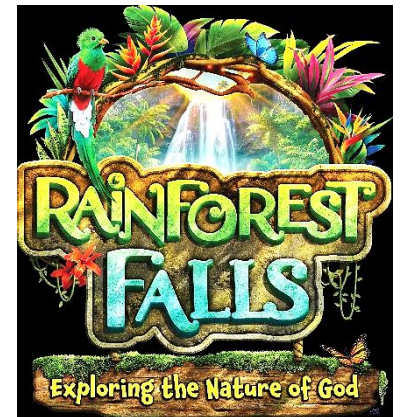

Highlights from the January 12, 2026, Council Meeting:

Treasurer’s Report: December income was \$43,656.36 with expenses of \$37,919.91; leaving the General Fund at \$140,606.86. Other 12/31/25 balances were: Youth Account \$14,044.61; Momentum One (Schade Scholarship) \$831,286.38; Momentum Two \$312,392.96; Memorial Fund \$35,388.75. Have paid \$10,000 towards basement carpet to date. Received a trust check of \$30,000 designated for the building fund.

Staff Reports: *Pastor* – Average Sunday attendance was 68 at 8AM and 98 at 10:15AM. Christmas Eve services were well attended. YouTube views remain constant. LCMS President Voter registration deadline is coming up. Each congregation gets 2 votes: 1 pastoral & 1 lay person. Craig Edwards has agreed to represent St. Matthew. Saturday, January 10 we hosted a “Walk Thru the Bible Seminar” with 102 people in attendance. *Roxie* – Noon Fellowship attendee numbers have been slightly down. Parent Sunday School has great group discussions. *Lorenda* – Thank you to the students, parents, teachers, and music helpers for all of their work with the Sunday School Christmas Program. Thank you to all who made the Christmas services meaningful. *Alexie & David* – Had 10 youth attend the Christmas Party. Working on planning more fellowship events. Have 20 youth and 6 adult chaperones registered for the summer mission trip.

Elders: Each Elder to contact 10 members to complete the “Re-Vitality” survey.

Trustees: Basement carpet project is starting. Lights in archway have been completed.

Board of Education: Sunday School attendance has dropped since Christmas.

Ministry Planning: Discussed making a list of those that volunteer for various tasks for the church so that maybe others could see and possibly sign-up for the different opportunities that are available to help with. Will be asking for groups to volunteer to prepare and serve the Lent Meals. Council will do February 18, Youth will do March 4, and Ministry Planning will do March 11. That leaves 3 open dates to serve yet.

The next Administrative Council Meeting is scheduled for Monday, February 9 at 5:30 p.m.
