Contact Randall Fields if you are interested in becoming a cantor. Training is available for anyone interested.



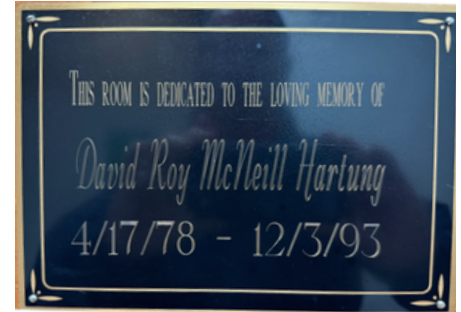


David Hartung Memorial Plaque

Have you ever wondered who David Hartung was and why there is a memorial plaque outside the Youth Room at MLC?

Those who worked on the roof during the construction of our facility formed a special bond, especially during the hot days of June and July 1993. David Hartung, the fifteen-year-old son of one of Messiah's founding families, was one of the strongest and most dedicated of the group.

Tragically, less than six months later, he died in an auto accident at the intersection of Hwy 72 and Slaughter Road. A family memorial service was held in our half-completed sanctuary, followed by a funeral at Trinity Baptist Church on Hughes Road that overflowed with people grieving the loss of this beloved young man. Although MLC has very few individual memorial items, members thought it appropriate to dedicate the Youth Room to David's memory.

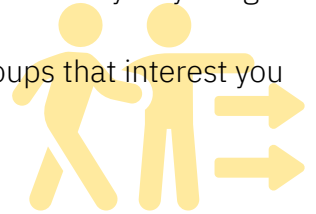
Sunday Service Needs

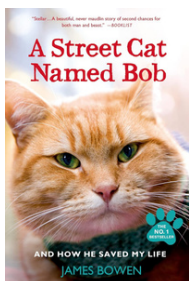
