1. The _____ to Failure

2. The _____ of Failure

The rebellious soul will be ignorant of the departure of the LORD. His wisdom, His guidance, the very strength for life is lost when we forsake the ways of God.

Ephesians 4:18 ~ They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart.

3. The _____ of God

We read one of the most encouraging passages ever penned. Despite the failure, despite the fall, God brought about a redemption that was illustrated in Samson's hair. At the point of his failure, came God's redemption.

James 2:13 ~ For judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

4. The _____ of God

Disgraced in the eyes of the world, humiliated in the sight of men, God remembered Samson and gave him strength. My friends, the consequences of sin are great—but the grace of God is greater still! Humble yourself, repent, and know that God remembers you.

1 Timothy 1:16 ~ But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life.

1 Peter 5:6-7

Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you.
